Big Idea: The way of wisdom in work

Proverbs Theme: Wisdom begins with the fear of the Lord.

Proverbs 1:7, 9:10

#### Fear of the Lord:

- \*Throughout the Old Testament, the 'fear of Yahweh' represents total devotion to God as the heart of Israel's "true" religion.
  - \*To fear Yahweh is to sense His power and holiness (Exodus 20:20) and, yet, at the same time, to embrace Him in love and obedience. (Deut. 10:16)
    - \*True wisdom exists in a relationship with a God who is both gracious in His embrace and severe in His judgment.
