Weekly Prayer Focus

World Missions–Sameh and Samah: Sameh and Samah are an Egyptian couple, both theologically trained, who along with their young son Selim, serve with Resurrection Church in Beirut. They're engaged in teaching, discipleship, leadership formation, and helping the under-resourced. The need is huge, and the workers are few. Lebanon is going through a very bad economic crisis causing approximately 80 percent of the population to be on the brink of poverty. Pray for the Lord to use these harsh conditions to bring many to Himself and for Sameh and Samah to show the love of Christ as they serve and minister to the people of Beirut.

Domestic Missions–World Relief Memphis: World Relief Memphis exists to empower the local church to serve the most vulnerable. World Relief laments the Russian invasion of Ukraine, which has created a refugee crisis. Pray for World Relief as they learn more about how they will be responding to the crisis, particularly as they continue responding to the recent Afghan arrivals in Memphis.

2PC Ministry–Shine Ministry: The Shine Ministry at Second serves individuals and families with special needs by communicating and demonstrating the good news of Christ's love for all people. They do this through their weekly Sunday School class, Jumping for Jesus on Wednesday nights, the Shadow program (which allows students to stay with their peers in appropriate grade levels while receiving biblical, differentiated learning), and more. Pray for God to bless the search for a new full-time Shine Coordinator to lead this vital ministry. Pray for Joy Prom on April 29—that all participants will have fun, feel loved, and experience the joy and love of Jesus at this event. Pray for all of our Shine families and their children—that God would keep them healthy and bring flourishing through strong support systems. Pray for the Lord to uphold these families when they feel overwhelmed and for our church body to proactively come alongside them and encourage them.

May Second Day Prayer & Congregational Prayer Meeting

Alongside churches throughout the city, Second dedicates one day each month to lift our voices to the Lord in prayer for 24 consecutive hours, asking God to expand and flourish His kingdom here in Memphis. Our next prayer day is **Monday, May 2**. Visit 2pc.org/pray to sign up for your 30-minute prayer time and mark your calendar to intercede on behalf of our city.

Also, mark your calendar for our monthly in-person Congregational Prayer Meeting on **Wednesday, May 4**. We will gather as a church family at noon in the Fellowship Hall. All are invited, and registration is not required.
