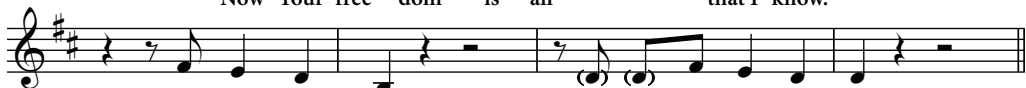

Weekly Prayer Focus

World Missions–The Youngs: The Youngs are facing growing religious tension and strife between Muslims and Hindus in their country. To prevent further violence, the government periodically shuts down internet access, complicating transportation, schooling, and business. Pray for the Lord to provide workarounds and strength during these times. They are praising God for much good news as his follow-up doctor visit in June gave him the all-clear from last year's emergency brain surgery. Both have spoken recently to multi-cultural gatherings; pray that these Christians' faith and love will grow stronger every day. Pray for peace in their country and for the Lord to use them as agents of peace. Finally, pray for those often harassed and persecuted for their faith in Jesus.

Domestic Missions–Adult and Teen Challenge: Adult and Teen Challenge of Memphis (ATCM) is a Christ-centered residential and re-entry program for adult men seeking to overcome addiction. ATCM praises God for their June graduates. Pray for the ministry's 50th Anniversary Banquet taking place in September—that they will take this opportunity to share the good news of five decades of miracles.

2PC Ministry–AMEN Men's Bible Study: AMEN is a rich time of Bible study and fellowship that equips men of all generations to be the husbands, fathers, friends, church members, and business/community leaders that Christ calls them to be. Fostering a high commitment to God's Word and one another, AMEN helps men build a strong foundation for a life of abiding in Christ, obeying Christ, and sharing Christ alongside other believers. Pray for George Robertson, Todd Erickson, and Barton Kimbro as they lead the men of AMEN through a study of I and II Thessalonians this Fall. Pray also for God to convict, strengthen, and encourage men through this study. Finally, pray that the Lord would bring to this study men who have been involved for years, as well as many newcomers, younger men, and students.

Alongside churches throughout the city, Second dedicates one day each month to lift our voices to the Lord in prayer for 24 consecutive hours, asking God to expand and flourish His kingdom here in Memphis.
