A SERVICE OF Nine Lessons and Carols

The Service of Nine Lessons and Carols tells the story of the fall of humanity, the promise of the Messiah, and the birth of Jesus in nine Bible readings from Genesis, the prophetic books, and the Gospels, interspersed with the singing of Christmas carols, hymns, and choral music.

The format was based on an order drawn up by Edward White Benson, later Archbishop of Canterbury but at that time Bishop of Truro, in Cornwall, for use on Christmas Eve 1880. Tradition says that he organized a 10:00 p.m. service on Christmas Eve in a temporary wooden shed serving as his cathedral and that a key purpose of the service was to keep men out of pubs on Christmas Eve.

The original liturgy has since been adapted and used by other churches all over the world. The best-known version has broadcast annually from King's College, Cambridge, on Christmas Eve since 1918. It features carols sung by the College's famous choir. Our tradition at Second Presbyterian Church is based on this service.

Spirit, "that they may rest from their labors, for their deeds follow them!"





Pray also for the Lord to compel some of our younger members to join our "Senior Varsity" initiative, where they can "adopt" a few of our senior saints who are no longer able to participate physically in our worship services and Sunday School classes. Finally, pray for God to guide each senior adult member to the ministry that He has for them and for these members to experience a fruitful return on their joyful service.
