



World Missions Conference Speakers

Morning Worship: Thomas McIntyre has been a missionary with OMF International in Taiwan for 13 years. He grew up at Second, is a graduate of Reformed Theological Seminary, and is ordained in the EPC. Thomas is pursuing a Doctor of Ministry from Knox Theological Seminary. He and his wife, Jennifer, started a church in Zhongpu—one of the most unreached areas of Taiwan. Their church plant was recently turned over to a local pastor, and they look forward to starting a new church plant later this year in another unreached area called Xingang.

Sunday Night Worship: Roger Lowther is the founder and director of Community Arts Tokyo, director of Faith & Art at Grace City Church Tokyo, and coordinator for the MAKE Collective, a global network of artists working in foreign missions. He has been serving with Mission to the World since 2003. Roger received a Master of Music from The Juilliard School and a Bachelor of Science from Columbia University. He is currently pursuing a Master of Arts in Theological Studies at Reformed Theological Seminary. He lives in downtown Tokyo with his wife Abi and children.






Weekly Prayer Focus

World Missions—As we focus on what the Lord is doing around the world this weekend, pray that we will let Him reshape our view of missions as we see how He is working through our partners.
