### On-Campus Mask Policy

**On Sunday, May 23, we implemented an updated on-campus mask policy; details are outlined below.**

- Masks are optional for vaccinated individuals on our church campus for all worship services and events.
- If you are not vaccinated, we ask that you continue to wear a mask to help protect those who cannot be or have not yet been vaccinated.
- Children above age 2 should continue to wear masks.
- Social distancing between family units continues to be recommended.
- Every other pew in the back floor section of the Sanctuary will continue to be roped off for those who prefer greater distancing.
- All pastors, liturgists, singers, and musicians serving on Sundays in the Chancel are vaccinated.
- Volunteers serving in our Children’s Ministry (nursery and children’s Sunday School), regardless of vaccination status, will continue to wear masks when in the rooms with children, per the CDC’s recommendation.
- Also, reservations are no longer required for PK-5th grade Sunday School. Weekly reservations continue to be required to attend the nursery. Visit [2pckids.org](https://2pckids.org) to learn more.

*These adjustments are consistent with CDC recommendations and Shelby County Health Department directives. We are comfortable with this update due to the availability of vaccines, the sufficiency of our ventilation system, and the excellent experience we have had with no COVID infections arising from contacts on campus.*

SCRIPTURE LESSON. . . . . I Corinthians 12:12–26

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. <sup>13</sup>For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and all were made to drink of one Spirit.

<sup>14</sup>For the body does not consist of one member but of many. <sup>15</sup>If the foot should say, “Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body,” that would not make it any less a part of the body. <sup>16</sup>And if the ear should say, “Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body,” that would not make it any less a part of the body. <sup>17</sup>If the whole body were an eye, where would be the sense of hearing? If the whole body were an ear, where would be the sense of smell? <sup>18</sup>But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as

he chose. <sup>19</sup>If all were a single member, where would the body be? <sup>20</sup>As it is, there are many parts, yet one body.

<sup>21</sup>The eye cannot say to the hand, “I have no need of you,” nor again the head to the feet, “I have no need of you.” <sup>22</sup>On the contrary, the parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, <sup>23</sup>and on those parts of the body that we think less honorable we bestow the greater honor, and our unpresentable parts are treated with greater modesty, <sup>24</sup>which our more presentable parts do not require. But God has so composed the body, giving greater honor to the part that lacked it, <sup>25</sup>that there may be no division in the body, but that the members may have the same care for one another. <sup>26</sup>If one member suffers, all suffer together; if one member is honored, all rejoice together.

## Weekly Focus on Missions
