



Our Speaker Today

Since 2012, Dr. Hans Madueme has served as an Associate Professor of Theological Studies at Covenant College. Before earning his MDiv and PhD, Dr. Madueme earned a medical degree and completed an internal medicine residency. During this time, he began asking himself whether full-blooded, robust Reformed theology was still viable in the modern world. He went on to write his PhD dissertation in systematic theology, honing in on the doctrine of sin and difficult questions from biology. In addition to his passion for preaching and teaching, he desires to mobilize first-rate scholars from the Reformed Christian tradition to make substantive contributions to the broader science-theology debate. He and his wife Shelley are blessed with two children.

Weekly Prayer Focus

World Missions–David and Lisa: David and Lisa continue to serve in East Asia. Now in a new building that allows for social distancing, David and Lisa are still helping others understand how to study God's Word and walk in obedience to that Word as well as teaching them how to reach out to their neighbors. Please pray for them as new laws and COVID continue to make life challenging. Pray also for their visa renewal process this month.

Domestic Missions–Families Matter: The mission of Families Matter is to strengthen families, change lives, and transform Memphis by empowering families to become their best selves in Christ. They praise God for the ability to serve Memphis and Shelby County with their healthy family/healthy relationships educational initiatives and request prayer for God to prosper these efforts. Pray also for students and parents involved to come to know Christ as Savior and Lord.
