Weekly Prayer Focus

World Missions–Allison Neubert: Allison is an eight-year veteran of Campus Outreach (CO) who began service in South Africa just over 10 months ago. She reports that things are normalizing on campus after the pandemic, though she did contract Covid. With her health on the mend, she and the CO team are welcoming summer short-term missionary students and lift praises for support from the South African Foundation. The men's ministry is growing as they had prayed for, and 17 college students are in town for cross cultural projects. In June, their City Conference (the first since 2019) provided a means for students to discuss life issues as directed by the gospel. Pray for Allison's continued recovery and for many students to hear and respond to the gospel this summer through CO's conferences, projects, and growing campus community.

Domestic Missions–Service Over Self: SOS is a neighborhood restoration ministry that seeks to bring more of God's shalom into their partner neighborhoods of Binghampton, The Heights, and Orange Mound through volunteer home repair and leadership development. SOS summer camps are in full swing! Pray for good weather and the ability to complete all the roofs they've planned on finishing. Pray also for their campers, summer staff, and homeowner partners to experience more of God's kingdom through SOS summer camps.

2PC Ministry–Caring Ministry: Led by David Bowen, Donna Sanders, and Kathy Oswalt, the Caring Ministry at Second exists to walk alongside members who are experiencing suffering, illness, loss, or grief, as well as to provide support for members serving their loved ones in caregiving roles. Pray for the Caring Ministry Team as they re-engage post-Covid in systematic visitation of our senior adult members. Pray that the team would enlist volunteers from each parish to join the Senior Varsity, allowing our eldest members to connect with loving neighbors and fellow members. Pray for God to fill Second's senior adults with hope, joy, and peace as they trust in Him (*Romans 15:13*).
