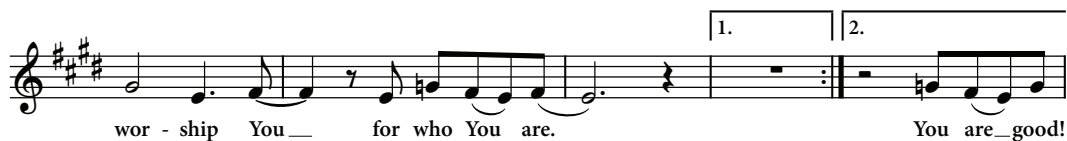

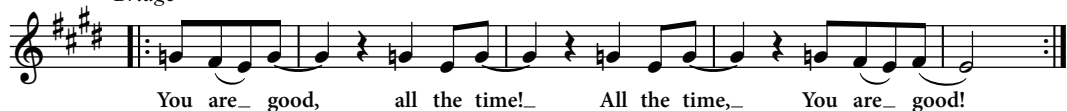

Weekly Prayer Focus

World Missions–John and Dawn: John and Dawn are regional directors and coaches in Southeast Asia. Their strong testimony while on extended home ministry assignment acknowledges God's grace and direction (Proverbs 16:9) as they navigate health issues and family responsibilities. They will continue their ministry to colleagues in Southeast Asia and North Africa via Zoom with regular visits face-to-face. During a teaching visit in December, John saw the witness of a small group of new believers bring more than 700 people to faith in Christ. Pray for their continued reliance on God's timing as they "walk the journey with His global church."

Domestic Missions–Kingdom Community Builders: Kingdom Community Builders (KCB) is a community development ministry that seeks to build on the strengths of Orange Mound and offer real-life solutions to real-life problems by establishing a network of community development partners and practitioners. The staff praises God for meeting KCB's financial needs and providing a grant for small business development in Orange Mound! They praise Him as well for raising up a team that facilitated Tuesday Game Nights in June. As the ministry looks ahead to the Fall, pray for God to provide them with economic development partners as well as presenters for an Urban Summit in September. Pray also for wisdom regarding whether to resume tutoring this Fall.

2PC Ministry–Restoration and Peacemakers Ministry: The Restoration and Peacemakers Ministry (RPM) seeks to help resolve conflict and restore broken relationships by following the blueprint laid out in Matthew 18. This ministry flows from the gospel, for God the Son came to bring peace by restoring us to God the Father. RPM works under the authority of the church Session, with the supervision of an oversight committee and Second's pastoral staff, to help members resolve problems relating to personal or business disputes, addictions, abuse, marital infidelity, dysfunctional relationships, and more. Pray for the men and women in our church who are hurting, particularly from the pain of broken relationships. Praise God for leaders who are willing to walk alongside others in their pain; ask God to grant these pastors and leaders wisdom as they help church members navigate various challenges, particularly relationships requiring Biblical restoration.
