## PREPARATION FOR MORNING WORSHIP

Our Hymn of Preparation, "All I Have Is Christ," was written by Jordan Kauflin, a pastor at Reformed Church of Arlington, Virginia. Since its release in 2008, congregations all over the world (Croatia, Russia, China, Japan, Korea, and Mexico) have come to love this modern-day hymn and sing it regularly in corporate worship.

One of the many reasons this song is beloved by Christians around the world is because it encapsulates both the folly of the human condition and the joy of the Christian experience. Our natural tendency is to rely upon our own methods, wisdom, and strength to find true joy; a "hell-bound race" marked with rebellion that only ends in darkness and despair.

However, as the progression of the song indicates, hope is found in the Gospel! In fact, the hope and joy of the Gospel is so infinitely great that it leads those who are in Christ to say, "Hallelujah! All I have is Christ. Hallelujah! Jesus is my life."

After reflecting upon his life before his own conversion, the apostle Paul made the same declaration: "But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord" (Philippians 3:7-8).

Church family, as those loved by God in Christ, let us count everything as loss and joyfully worship Jesus, our light and life!
