
In today's section Matthew shows that:

Recapitulation defined

Jesus is the True Israel...

He is the One who recapitulates Israel's history in order to do what Israel failed to do and gain the blessing of a life perfectly lived before God.



How Does The Life Of Messiah Jesus Reflect The History Of Israel? Israel - The Children of Israel journeyed to Egypt to escape certain death at the hands of famine. (Genesis 42:1-47:12)

Messiah - Jesus and His family fled into Egypt to escape certain death at the hands of King Herod. (Matthew 2:13-18)

Matthew chapter 3:


John the Baptist parallels Elijah... preparing the way for the Lord





• Israel- The Israelites were baptized in the Red Sea as they fled from the Egyptian army. (Exodus 14:10-13)

 Messiah - Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist at the start of His earthly ministry. (Matthew 3:13-17)



Jesus the Beloved Son

Parallels to Israel and to the "anointed one" expected by Isreal. For example:

-Psalm2:7

-lsaiah 42:1

Israel -The Jewish Nation were tested, tempted, failed in the wilderness. (Exodus 16:1-17:7)

Messiah – Jesus spent 40 days in the wilderness, being tempted by Satan, before He began His earthly ministry. (Matthew 4:1-11)
