Weekly Prayer Focus

World Missions–Rob and Tunde Futo: The Futos have served in Budapest, Hungary for 22 years. Rob is a pastor of Cornerstone Church, and Tunde is a worship leader and counselor. They praise God for the recent City-to-City church planting training course Rob helped lead, as well as for the counseling training conference they both led, with more than 40 people in attendance. They report that their youth groups continue to flourish, and they have recently baptized Iranian immigrants and new Pakistani Christians. Please pray for God’s guidance as Cornerstone serves several Ukrainian refugees. Pray for God to bless their efforts to plant a church next year. In all things, pray for Cornerstone to be a light in the darkness.

Domestic Missions–EcOp: Economic Opportunities seeks to equip ex-offenders with spiritual mentoring, GED training, financial literacy, and the skills and resources needed to obtain stable employment. Pray for God to grow their recruitment networks in Memphis and beyond, that there may be more job opportunities for the population they serve. Pray against the senseless violence that affects EcOp’s participants and their communities—that God would put a stop to it. Pray also for EcOp participants battling substance abuse, and praise the Lord for the healing He has already brought in one participant’s life. Finally, pray for God to grant wisdom to the EcOp staff as they lead.

2PC Ministry–Senior Adult Ministry: Led by David Bowen, Second’s Senior Adult Ministry serves the senior saints at 2PC. Our senior adults lead our congregation with wisdom and serve one another and our younger members as Elders, Deacons, and leaders in ministries both within our church and around the city. Pray for our senior adults to be faithful to Christ all the way to the end of their lives and to teach other members how to do the same. Pray also for more of our younger members in each parish to join the Senior Varsity, our ministry to homebound members, so that no one feels alone or forgotten.





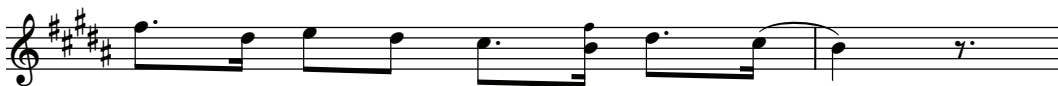
