D. Eyes on God (Ps. 51:1)

2. From these texts, what do we learn that God really wants from us?
3. How does Psalm 51 exalt Christ?

### **Being:**

1. What aspects of Saul's disobedience described in 1 Samuel 15 resonate with you?
2. What does it do to your heart to know that our disobedience can only be overcome by the good news of Jesus?

### **Doing:**

1. What do we find in Psalm 51 to lead us to praise, thanksgiving, confession, intercession?
2. In what ways do you need to learn to repent like David? How can your fellow men help you?
