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# HOW TO USE THIS BOOK

The book you now have in your hands has been a labor of love. It began with a realization that no matter how excellent and effective our teaching may be, it cannot compete with the influence of you as parents. God has called you specifically and gifted you uniquely to lead your kids “in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.” Plainly said, you are the greatest spiritual influence in the lives of your kids. To some of you that is a very intimidating and overwhelming thought (I know I feel that way).

Therefore, we as the church want to help encourage and equip you in your role as the primary discipler of your children, and that is why this book exists. Our goal is to set you up in the best way that we can to have spiritual conversations as a family. Our hope is that you will have opportunities on Sundays, perhaps at lunch after Sunday school, as well as a couple of times a week with the Family Devotionals provided, to talk about God and His importance in our everyday lives.

To help accomplish this, we have standardized the Sunday school curriculum so that everyone from JK-12th grade will be learning the same things each week (age appropriately, of course). This allows you as parents to know exactly what all of your kids are learning without having to keep track of multiple e-mails or schedules. Below you will find exactly what is included and how best to use it.

## OUTLINE

We provide you with the main points that your students will be learning each week. We do this so you can be best prepared to discuss what they learned and answer any questions that might come up. We also have included a lengthy section of context for each lesson. We believe it is important for all of us to see how each story in the Bible does not stand alone, but instead fits into the larger drama that God has unfolded.

## **FOLLOW-UP QUESTIONS**

The point of these questions is to be conversation starters for you as a family. They are not exhaustive as to the content of what your children have learned that Sunday, but should just get things started for your family. Our hope is that your children will come to expect a conversation about what they learned in Sunday school for two main reasons. First, we want them to see spiritual conversations as a normal and important part of life and second, we hope this expectation will make them more attentive to what they are learning.

## **FAMILY DEVOS**

We have provided two days worth of Family Devotionals for you to do as a family at home. We chose this number so as to not overwhelm families or discourage them for not being able to live up to expectations. Our hope is that the two provided will be a springboard for even more times of family worship during the

week. The two we have included will help build a foundation for the Bible character that they will study on Sunday. You will also see a page on "How to Do Family Devotions" which is there only as a resource for you and not a concrete model that must be followed. In the end, the most important thing is for families to spend time together focused on God's Word and prayer; how that is accomplished is secondary.

# HOW TO DO FAMILY DEVOTIONS

When discussing family devotions, the first thing you must know is that there is not just one correct way to do them. Each family is made up of distinct individuals, each with a different personality. Therefore, trying to create a “one-size-fits-all” approach to family devotions is foolish. Below are some helpful hints and guidelines as you lead your devotions. Some of them will be very helpful, while some you will realize do not work for your family. In the end, the point is for you as a family to take time together, reading God’s Word and praying together. However you accomplish this is truly a secondary concern.

## **PLACE MATTERS**

- It will be important to find a consistent place where you always do family devotions. Changing the location can drastically change the dynamics.
- Everyone should be at the same eye level. You don’t want some on the floor and some in chairs or on the couch. This will encourage participation by all members because they will feel as if they are a part of the group.
- Minimize the distractions. Honestly, doing family devotions is hard enough! Only you know what might distract your kids so be sure you eliminate as many interruptions as possible.

## **PRAYER MATTERS**

- It is important for your children to see the importance of prayer. Therefore, be sure that you pray to begin and end your time together. Often it works best to choose one family member to open the time in prayer (which also helps settle busy hearts). At the end is an opportunity to let everyone pray.
- Give your children a role in prayer. One of the things that my family does that has been successful is that we have four prayer categories: 1- Zachary’s class, 2- Bryson’s Class, 3- Our extended family and friends, and 4- Missions. Each time we give someone in the house one of these prayer categories. To minimize the “I want...” of our children, we rotate who assigns who to prayer. That way, everyone gets a chance to decide who prays for what. It has saved a lot of disagreements. For our missions category, we alternate between a Mission Memphis partner and a World Missions partner and it has been such a blessing to watch and hear our kids pick up on and pray for those ministries. We also switch it up some nights and just have a time of confession or adoration or thanksgiving so they don’t think of God as just someone from whom you ask things.

## THE WORD MATTERS

- God's Word is the only thing He promises will bear fruit. It is so important to not only expose them to God's Word but also to teach them how to think about it. One of the best ways to start doing this is to continually remind them that these stories are REAL – Isaiah 55:11.
- Get them to interact with the Bible for themselves. It is a huge temptation to just provide the answers for them (since we know everything) but they will get so much more out of it if they think about it for themselves. The hardest part for me in this is that I lose the control. I have to constantly remind myself that I want them to get something out of God's Word and not get frustrated when they don't get out what I want them to.
- Encourage every little step. It will be very important to encourage every interaction they have with God's Word. They will be more willing to share when they know it is a safe place for them to come with their thoughts. At times, that will mean you are going to go down some rabbit trails, but it will be worth the journey. As a part of that, you need to make sure that they get the truth; this means gently correcting when their theology gets out of whack.

## TIME MATTERS

- One of the most important things you are teaching your children is that being together is very important. Just the simple act of carving out time every week that does not involve the TV or a meal out will bear fruit. The intentional act of studying the Word and prayer together will bear fruit even if it is down the line.
- Have fun! I know it sounds silly but if your kids have fun doing family devotions, they will want to keep doing them. For us, that is a short game or a role playing moment at the beginning but for you, it can be whatever. Sometimes I think we are afraid that we will be irreverent when we attempt to have fun, but we must remember that God created fun and laughter, so participating in those activities pleases Him.

# D6 DRIVING VALUES

At Second, we believe in three guiding principles, known as the D6 Driving Values. We hope that as you and your family go through these devotions together, you will be further encouraged in your relationship with the Lord, your church community, and in your Kingdom mission.

## The Lord is my primary devotion.

- Confronted by the holiness of Christ, I seek Him in daily worship, prayer, and repentance. *Isaiah 6:1-8*
- Compelled by the love of Christ, I strive to be obedient to Him in my thoughts, words, and deeds. *II Corinthians 5:14*
- Created new in Christ, my identity is no longer in the things of this world. *II Corinthians 5:17*
- Confident of the eternity secured for me in Christ, I have peace in the midst of the troubles of this life. *Phillipians 4:6-7*

## The Church is my primary community.

- Knowing that the Gospel liberates me from idols, I cannot imagine not joyfully worshipping God every week with my brothers and sisters in Christ. *Thessalonians 1:9b*
- Knowing that the Church is called to be a holy nation, set apart from the things of the world, I will embrace this calling by seeking to be Christ-like in all aspects of my life. *I Peter 2:9-12*
- Knowing that I am a steward of my resources and not an owner, I cheerfully release my resources to build His Kingdom and not my own. *Matthew 25:14-30*
- Knowing that the Body of Christ is essential to my sanctification, I actively seek relationship and accountability within the church in order to grow in Christ. *Ephesians 4:11-16*
- Knowing that God has given me spiritual gifts to use in the church, I willingly serve. *I Corinthians 12:4-7*
- Knowing that Jesus is present where two or more are gathered in His name, I happily pray with and for my brothers and sisters in Christ. *Matthew 18:20*

## Building Christ's Kingdom is my primary mission.

- Belonging to Christ's Kingdom causes us to live as a distinct people who are called to be about applying Christ's work of redemption as far as the curse is found as we eagerly await His imminent return and the renewal of all things. *Romans 8:19-21*
- Building Christ's Kingdom in all of life is an act of worship, and the reason I am alive is to multiply worshippers and redeem culture. *II Corinthians 5:16-21*
- Building Christ's Kingdom begins in multiplying worshippers of Christ in my own household. *Joshua 24:15*
- Building Christ's Kingdom is the lens through which I filter every decision as I further the work of redemption. *Romans 12:1-2*
- Building Christ's Kingdom prioritizes Christ's work of redemption to the extent of intentionally sacrificing our time, money, and talents in furthering the application of the redemption of Christ. *I Corinthians 10:31-33*



# WHO IS THIS JESUS?

*And they were filled with great fear and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?" Mark 4:41*

It is pretty early in Jesus' earthly ministry and He constantly finds Himself surrounded by the crowds on a daily basis. The people are drawn to this new traveling rabbi who not only teaches but does so with great power. Rumors swirl about the miracles He performs so people come to see this man for themselves. They are so fascinated by Jesus because He is different from the religious leaders they find at the temple. Therefore, the news about Him is moving quickly throughout the whole region and the crowds grow daily. The people crowd around and hang on every word, but they are still unsure as to who this man is. Is he Elijah returned? Is he another prophet? Is he a deceiver? Is he a revolutionary who has come to free us from Rome? Could he be the long awaited Messiah?

Along with the growing throngs of people, Jesus has a small band of consistent followers. Each of them has had a unique and powerful experience with Jesus and they respond by giving up their whole lives to travel around with Him as His disciples. They have had a front row view to many things that they can't explain and have been constantly hearing Jesus speak about the Kingdom of God. Still, we find that even with all the evidence they have seen and heard, they too have questions about who this Jesus really is.

We see this very clearly when they witness Jesus calming the storm. It had been a hard day of ministry and Jesus and the disciples leave in a boat to cross the Sea of Galilee. On the way, Jesus falls asleep and a great storm comes up and the disciples fear for their lives. They wake Jesus not in expectation of a miracle but simply as another hand to row and bail out the boat. Instead, we are told that Jesus "rebuked the winds and said to the sea, 'Peace! Be still!'" and the waves and the winds obeyed Jesus and became calm.

The disciples found themselves dumbfounded by what occurred and perplexed at what it all meant. All that they thought they knew about who Jesus was was called into question. They knew He was a great teacher and they knew He could do some miracles, but it was something else entirely for Him to have mastery over that which man could not control, nature itself. This encounter was a turning point in the lives of the disciples as they went from following a rabbi to an acknowledgement that they were with the Son of God. Unfortunately, their faith wavered at times and they needed constant reminders of who Jesus was, but then, don't we need those too?

"Who is Jesus?" There is no more important question that any of us will answer in our lives, for our answer to it determines our eternity. As Christians today, we find ourselves confronted with the same doubts and concerns of the crowd around us. Many are curious about Jesus but prefer to put Him in a box where He can be managed and controlled. We live in a cynical world that distrusts anything that can't be seen or easily quantified. Therefore, we need to be SURE of who Jesus is in order not only to live for Him in this world but also to share the words of eternal life we have been given through Him.

Therefore, this year we will attempt to become experts on Jesus. Like good detectives, we will follow the clues that God has left for us so we can be prepared for the doubts of the world, as well as of our own hearts, about Jesus.

Ultimately, what I want us to do is see Jesus for who He truly is (the embodiment of God the Father) and once we do to find Him ultimately fulfilling and beautiful. Based on those assumptions, my hope and goal is to answer these fundamental questions with each account of Jesus we study:

- What does this account tell me about Jesus?
- Why is it important that Jesus is this or does this for me?
- How should I live differently because of who Jesus is?

# SON OF GOD

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## MATTHEW 3:13-17

### Context

- Jesus has come to the Earth and is about to begin His ministry
- God had sent John the Baptist to prepare the hearts of the people for the coming of the Messiah
- John and his followers had been baptizing and telling people to repent
- Jesus Himself goes out to John in wilderness to also be baptized

### Outline

#### I. Jesus came out to be baptized

- A. John the Baptist was baptizing those who were repenting of their sins
  - i. They were sorry and wanting to turn away from their sin
- B. Jesus didn't need to be baptized
  - i. He hadn't sinned
  - ii. His baptism was for our sakes
    - a. Wanted to make connection between John the Baptist's ministry and His
      - 1. To show that John was the one spoken about in Isaiah
    - b. Wanted to identify with us
    - c. Was the perfect situation to start His ministry
      - 1. God would speak to Him for the crowd to hear

#### II. Holy Spirit shows up at Jesus' baptism

- A. Falls on Him like a dove
  - i. Dove was symbol of purity and peace
  - ii. So that all could see

B. Rested on Him

- i. Stayed with Him more than just a moment

**III. God shows up at Jesus' baptism**

A. When babies get baptized it is so fun to watch the parents' faces

- i. They are so happy and proud of their little one

B. God the Father shows up to speak to His Son

- i. A voice from heaven

- a. The people around heard what God said

- b. They hadn't heard from God in 700 years

- c. Since the last prophets

- 1. Was a very big deal

- ii. Quotes from Isaiah 42:1

- a. Shows that Jesus is the Messiah who had been promised

- iii. This is my Son

- a. Makes it very plain and clear who Jesus was

- iv. Beloved Son

- a. Makes it very clear how God feels about Jesus

- v. With whom I am well pleased

- a. God recognizes Jesus' obedience

- 1. Gave up heaven to put on flesh and come to Earth

- 2. Willing to come and suffer and die for us

**IV. So What??!!**

A. Jesus is equal to God

- i. Made of the same substance

- ii. Has all the power and abilities that God has

B. Jesus gives us access to God

- i. As God's Son Jesus allows us to know God better



C. Jesus identifies with you

- i. Understands the hardships of humanity

# OUR GREAT HIGH PRIEST

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## MATTHEW 4:1-11

### Context

- Jesus has come to the Earth and is about to begin His ministry
- He had been baptized by John the Baptist as an outward sign of the beginning of His ministry
- Although he didn't need to be baptized He did so to relate to us
- At the baptism, God speaks to Jesus and the crowd proclaiming that Jesus is His Beloved Son with whom He is well pleased
- With this, Jesus' public ministry begins

### Outline

- I. Jesus' temptation was part of God's plan
  - A. He was led by the Spirit He was given at His baptism into wilderness to be tempted
  - B. God would use this moment for Jesus and for us
- II. Jesus' temptation
  - A. Came from the devil
    - i. Was actively trying to get Jesus to sin
    - ii. Temptation is not same as sin
      - a. Temptation is the invitation to sin
  - B. Started with fasting
    - i. Jesus didn't eat for 40 days and nights
    - ii. Would be very weak in that condition because He was human

**III. Temptation #1- Command these stones to become bread**

- A. Devil was questioning whether he was Son of God
  - i. Trying to appeal to His pride
  - ii. "If you are then prove it..."
- B. He was very hungry so bread would be a good thing
  - i. Needed food to survive
  - ii. Had power to turn stones to bread
- C. What was the problem?
  - i. Did Jesus trust God to provide for Him?
  - ii. If He did this He was taking things into His own hands instead of trusting God
    - a. Does God really love you?
    - b. Has God forgotten you?
- D. Jesus' Response
  - i. Quotes Scripture to Devil from Deuteronomy 8:3
  - ii. Knows that we need more than just physical things to live
    - a. Bread and things of this world will never truly satisfy us
  - iii. Obeying God was more important than eating

**IV. Temptation #2- Throw yourself down so God can save you and others will see who you are**

- A. Devil took Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem
  - i. Was the center of life in the city
  - ii. Always crowds there and around it
- B. Devil uses Scripture to tempt Jesus
  - i. Quotes from Psalm 91:11-12
  - ii. Was trying to use God's Word against Him
  - iii. If you really believe in God's Word then put it to the test
- C. What was the temptation?
  - i. Devil was trying to get Jesus to make it about Him
    - a. He could get people to believe in Him without having to suffer

- b. Could get a quick following without the hard work
      - 1. Would they truly believe or constantly ask for more signs
    - ii. If Jesus jumped off the temple and the crowds saw the angels keep Him from falling they would surely believe. Much easier way than living among them for three years
- D. Jesus' Response
  - i. Quotes Scripture back to the devil - Deuteronomy 6:16
  - ii. You shall not put the Lord your God to the test
    - a. Jesus was trusting God's plan
    - b. Knows that God loves Him and has best for Him so doesn't need God to constantly prove it to Him
- V. **Temptation #3- I will give you the world if you bow down to me**
  - A. Devil showed Jesus all the kingdoms of the world and promised them to Him
    - i. All Jesus had to do was bow down and worship the devil
  - B. Was a shortcut to accomplish His purpose
    - i. Get the world without the suffering of the cross
    - ii. God had already promised the nations to Jesus - Psalm 2:8
    - iii. Was not why He came
      - a. He didn't come to gain the world for Himself but to gain heaven for us
      - b. If He didn't suffer and die there would still be no hope in eternity for His followers
  - C. Jesus responds by telling Satan to leave Him and quotes Scripture again
- VI. **Jesus as our High Priest**
  - A. The High Priest would go before God for the people
    - i. Was the one who spoke to God on the people's behalf
    - ii. Offered sacrifices for the forgiveness of the people's sins
    - iii. Was a representative for them because He was like them
  - B. Jesus is the One that goes before God for us
    - i. He speaks to God on our behalf - Romans 8:34
    - ii. He was the perfect sacrifice for our sins - Romans 3:25
    - iii. He can represent us because He is like us - Hebrews 4:15

## VII. So What??!!

- A. Jesus undid what Adam and Eve did
  - i. Turned away from temptation instead of giving into it
  - ii. Gave us a way to stand up under temptation—Holy Spirit
- B. Jesus can relate to us when we are tempted
  - i. He was tempted in EVERY WAY just as we are yet was without sin
  - ii. He understands the ways that we are tempted and won us the victory over them
- C. How should we handle temptation then?
  - i. Know God's Word for ourselves
    - a. Know when someone is twisting it
    - b. Use it as a weapon against our enemy
  - ii. Tell Satan to be gone
    - a. If we are in Christ, we have the same Spirit that Jesus did
    - b. Need to stand up for what is right
    - c. Need to look for and take God's way out that He provides – 1 Corinthians 10:13

### Outline

- I. The people were asking who John the Baptist was
  - A. Many people were going to him
    - i. He would teach them and baptize them
    - ii. "Repent for the Kingdom of Heaven is near"
  - B. He told them who he was and who he wasn't
    - i. Was "voice crying out in wilderness"
      - a. Fulfillment of prophecy from Isaiah 40:3
      - b. Was the one who would come before the Messiah
    - ii. Was NOT the Messiah
      - a. Was the one who would point others to Him
- II. John the Baptist points people to Jesus
  - A. Knew his place and purpose
    - i. Verse 31- "...for this purpose I came baptizing with water, that He might be revealed to Israel."
  - B. When he saw Jesus he told others to follow Him
    - i. Knew who Jesus was
      - a. Lamb of God

- b. One who comes after will be greater
  - 1. I am not worthy to untie His sandal
- c. This is the Son of God
- ii. Even sent his own followers after Jesus

### III. Jesus as the Lamb of God

- A. Purpose- Will take away the sin of the world
  - i. Would die for the sins of the people
  - ii. Would pay for their sins so they can be forgiven
  - iii. Would allow people to be in heaven with God for eternity
- B. Picture- Passover- Exodus 12:1-13
  - i. The Israelites would select a perfect lamb
  - ii. They would kill the lamb and put its blood on the doorposts
  - iii. The angel of the Lord would see the blood and pass over them
  - iv. The blood saved them from punishment
- C. For us
  - i. Have you ever wondered why we don't sacrifice animals in church anymore?
  - ii. Jesus was our once-for-all sacrifice
  - iii. He lived perfect life and then died to pay the penalty of our sin and keep the wrath of God from getting to us
    - a. What we deserved was put on Jesus at the cross
    - b. Separation from God

### IV. So What??!!

- A. We don't have to perform to please God
  - i. Jesus did all the work for us
  - ii. We love and obey God out of thankfulness for what He has done
- B. We do have to have faith that Jesus takes away our sins and confess our sins to Him
- C. We should, like John the Baptist's disciples, follow Jesus

  - i. Already covered above
  - ii. Jews didn't associate with Samaritans
- C. Speaks to a sinful woman
  - i. Had a reputation
    - a. Had had 5 husbands
    - b. Living with a man not her husband
  - ii. Was why she drew water in middle of the day
    - a. Didn't want to interact with the people of the village
- D. Jesus went to an unlikely woman and talked with her

**IV. Jesus gives her truth**

- A. Calls her out on her sin
- B. Answers her questions about worship
- C. Tells her that He is the Messiah

**V. Her response**

- A. Because of Jesus going to her and sharing truth
- B. She goes to the town and tells them about her
  - i. Come and see
  - ii. One who tells me all that I ever did
  - iii. Can this be the Christ?

**VI. Result of all of this**

- A. Many in the town believed—verse 39
- B. Stayed for 2 days and taught them

## VII. So What??!!

- A. Jesus gave us an example to follow
  - i. Went to one the world had forgotten
  - ii. Went out of His way to speak to her and give her truth
  - iii. God used her to bring others to know Jesus

- b. Found a very valuable pearl
- c. Sold all he had to buy it

iii. What do these NOT mean?

- a. The Gospel is somehow hidden and we have to find it
- b. That once we realize the truth we have to work really hard and buy our salvation

iv. What does this mean?

- a. The Kingdom of Heaven is very valuable
  - 1. Easy to put value on things of this world but this is greater than all else
- b. The Kingdom of Heaven is worth it
  - 1. They willingly gave all they had for it
  - 2. It was worth any sacrifice and any price

III. So What??!!

A. God offers us something of great value—His Kingdom

- i. In eternity—eternity in His perfect presence
  - a. No crying, pain, suffering, death, sickness, stress, etc.
- ii. Now—I have come that they may have life and life to the full- John 10:10
  - a. God wants us to experience the fullness of life now
  - b. A life lived in service to God is full of joy

B. We should be willing to trade everything for it

- i. Many things will distract us from God
- ii. Is He your greatest treasure?

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**LUKE 8:22-25**

## Context

- Jesus has come to spread the Kingdom of God
- Crowds gathered around Jesus because of His teaching and the miracles He performed
- At the same time, Jesus was training His disciples in how to do ministry and helping them grow in their own faith

## Outline

- I. **Jesus and the disciples were leaving after long day of ministry**
  - A. Mark tells us in his account that it was at end of day filled with teaching
  - B. As they often did they were going to the other side
- II. **A storm comes up as they sail**
  - A. Many of the disciples were fishermen so they were used to sailing through storms
    - i. The Sea of Galilee is 600 feet below sea level and surrounded by mountains so storms can develop quickly and funnel down
    - ii. The storms have strong winds and create massive waves
  - B. This storm must have been especially bad
    - i. These seasoned fishermen were scared for their lives
      - a. Told Jesus that they were perishing
- III. **Jesus' response**
  - A. Jesus slept through the storm
    - i. Shows us that He is completely human
    - ii. He was so tired that the wind and waves didn't affect Him

B. Jesus spoke to the winds and waves

- i. He spoke to them like a misbehaving child
  - a. Mark tells us His words
  - b. Peace! Be still!
- ii. Only 3 words and the sea was calm
  - a. Typically a storm such as this lessens gradually before it stops but this one stopped immediately
- iii. He could have calmed it with His thoughts but wanted the disciples to hear and experience His power
  - a. He wanted them to have faith that He was in control
  - b. Reminded them that they had nothing to fear

C. Jesus questions their faith

- i. Seems not very nice to them after such a scary moment
- ii. They had forgotten all they had seen and heard
  - a. It's easy to forget what is true when things get hard
  - b. Have to remember in the dark what we knew to be true in the light
- iii. Jesus had given them a promise
  - a. Let us go across to the other side of the lake
  - b. They were called to trust Him at His word

D. The disciples were amazed and scared

- i. If Jesus can control nature and the weather then there is nothing that He can't do
- ii. For fishermen, storms at sea would be one of their biggest fears and Jesus showed them they had nothing to fear

IV. So What??!!

A. Jesus is WAY more powerful than you think He is

- i. Jesus could control nature which no one else can predict much less control
- ii. Jesus created the world so He can control it all
- iii. Jesus created us so He knows us best
- iv. Ephesians 3:20- Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us

- B. You can trust Jesus at His Word
  - i. He has given us many promises
    - a. Never leave or forsake us, We are His children, etc.
    - b. 2 Corinthians 1:20
- C. You can trust Jesus with your fears
  - i. Jesus knows your fears and has overcome them
  - ii. He has conquered sin and death so He has conquered your fears

# ONE WHO FREES

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## MARK 5:1-20

### Context

- Jesus has come to spread the Kingdom of God
- Crowds gathered around Jesus because of His teaching and the miracles He performed
- At the same time, Jesus was training His disciples in how to do ministry
- Jesus had just calmed the storm which caused the disciples to wonder who Jesus really was

### Outline

- I. **Jesus and the disciples were in land of the Gerasenes**
  - A. Small village by the Sea of Galilee
  - B. Had crossed the Sea by boat to get there
- II. **The problem**
  - A. There was a man in that village who had an unclean spirit
    - i. Lived among the tombs—not near other people
    - ii. Would constantly scream and cut himself
    - iii. The people were very scared of him and tried to stop him
      - a. He was so strong he couldn't be tied up or chained
      - b. No one was strong enough to control him
  - B. The man approaches Jesus when He got off the boat
    - i. Speaks to Jesus—unclean spirit did the talking
      - a. What are you going to do with me?
      - b. Please don't torture me
    - ii. Shows that he knew who Jesus was

- a. Jesus, Son of Most High God
- iii. Shows that he knew Jesus' power
  - a. Knew He could hurt the spirit and cast it out of the man

### III. Jesus' response

- A. Not afraid of the man like the crowd was
- B. Saw the man's real problem—was a prisoner
  - i. Not with chains or a jail but by the spirit
  - ii. Was hurting him and isolating him and there was nothing he could do
- C. Jesus frees the man
  - i. Tells the unclean spirit to come out
    - a. The spirit actually says that there were many spirits in him
  - ii. The Legion ask to go into the pigs
    - a. If they can't destroy the man they can the pigs
    - b. Jesus allows them to do that
    - c. Shows His concern for people over creation
    - d. Pigs ran into the sea and drowned

### IV. Response of the people

- A. People from the village
  - i. Heard what Jesus did and about the man and pigs
  - ii. They were afraid of Jesus' power
  - iii. Begged Jesus to leave them
- B. The man freed from the spirits
  - i. Man was completely healed
    - a. Sitting in his right mind
    - b. Could have a normal life again
  - ii. Asked to go with Jesus
    - a. Out of thankfulness for what Jesus had done for him
    - b. Wanted to be a part of His ministry

- iii. Jesus gave him a different mission
  - a. Sent him instead to his home and his friends
    - 1. People he knew well and knew him
    - 2. God wanted to use him to reach those who hadn't yet been able to hear
    - 3. He would have a ministry to them that no one else could have
  - b. Told him just to tell them what He had done for him
    - 1. Didn't have to have all the answers

**V. So What??!!**

- A. Jesus has freed us as well
  - i. We don't feel trapped, but sin has power over us
  - ii. Jesus freed us from power of sin by dying on the cross
  - iii. Jesus has set us free to love and follow Him
- B. How will you respond to Jesus?
  - i. Afraid
    - a. Are you scared what Jesus might ask you to do?
  - ii. Thankful
    - a. Do you realize all that He has done for you?
    - b. Are you willing to be used by God to spread the Gospel?
    - c. Is God's gift greater than your fear?
- C. Who has God placed in your life to tell about Jesus?
  - i. God has put people in your life so that He can get to them through you
  - ii. You may be the only Jesus that some people see every day
  - iii. Who are those people in your life?
    - a. In your family?
    - b. At your school?
    - c. In your neighborhood?

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## MARK 6:30-44

### Context

- Jesus has come to spread the Kingdom of God
- Crowds gathered around Jesus because of His teaching and the miracles He performed
- At the same time, Jesus was training His disciples in how to do ministry
- Jesus had just sent the disciples out in groups of two proclaiming and teaching

### Outline

- I. **The disciples return to Jesus and ready for a break**
  - A. Had been going to many towns and villages and calling people to repent
  - B. Going from home to home
  - C. Jesus was preparing them for some rest- verse 31
    - i. Come away to desolate place and rest
    - ii. Disciples got in boat to get away
- II. **The people interrupt**
  - A. Jesus and the disciples were recognized by the people
  - B. Word spread and a crowd literally ran around the lake from all the surrounding towns
    - i. They even beat the boat across
  - C. Jesus and disciples come ashore to find a large crowd waiting on them

### III. The compassion of Jesus

- A. Would have been easy to be a little frustrated
  - i. The plan was to rest and instead more ministry
  - ii. Wouldn't blame Jesus and disciples for just moving on
- B. Jesus truly saw the crowd
  - i. Not as an inconvenience but as people
  - ii. They were like sheep without a shepherd
    - a. Vulnerable, Scared, Alone, Helpless
  - iii. Jesus' heart goes out to them

### IV. The provision of Jesus

- A. Spiritual
  - i. Jesus knew their true need was to know God more
  - ii. Taught them many things about the Kingdom of God
- B. Physical
  - i. It was getting late and the people were getting hungry
  - ii. The disciples' solution
    - a. Send them away—too much for us
    - b. Needed to leave soon before it got dark so they could find food or have time to get home
  - iii. Jesus' solution
    - a. You give them something to eat
    - b. Would take 200 days of wages to feed them all
    - c. What disciples saw as problem Jesus saw as opportunity
    - d. Jesus simply asks the disciples what they have
- C. The connection
  - i. Jesus knew that His teaching was made more powerful and memorable when it was accompanied by His power
  - ii. Gave them not only great teaching but full bellies

**V. The power of Jesus**

- A. Jesus wants to be sure and give God the credit
  - i. Took loaves and fish and looked up to heaven and gave thanks
  - ii. Wanted the people to know that this came from God
    - a. He is the ultimate provider of our needs
- B. Jesus broke the bread and had the disciples hand it out
  - i. They organized the crowd into groups and the disciples served them the food
  - ii. They ALL ate and were satisfied
    - a. Jesus multiplied it so it was more than enough for everyone
    - b. More than they could have asked or expected
    - c. Crowd of 5,000 men—not included were the women and children so the crowd was likely much larger

**VI. The disciples were needy too**

- A. They also enjoyed the gift
- B. They needed to be reminded about God's power to increase their faith
- C. Jesus gave them a reminder that would last
  - i. 12 baskets full of bread were left - 1 for each unbelieving disciple
  - ii. As they ate the bread later, they would remember how God provided

**VII. So What??!!**

- A. Jesus has heart for needy, so should we
  - i. Need to look at them as Jesus did
    - a. Compassion and not disgust
- B. Jesus only asks us for what we have
  - i. Our job is to trust God with what we have and let Him do something amazing with it
- C. When we help those in need it needs to be in word AND in deed
  - i. James 2:14-17
  - ii. Our faith is shown by what we do
  - iii. Not just enough to offer kind words to those in need but to help

- D. We are also needy people
  - i. Jesus is compassionate to us so we should be to others
  - ii. Need more of Jesus daily
  - iii. Need to see His power and provision for us
  - iv. Need to be able to trust Him more

### Outline

- I. Jesus had given them specific instructions
  - A. Where to go
    - i. Go to lost sheep of Israel
    - ii. Those who had been awaiting the Messiah
  - B. What to say
    - i. The Kingdom of Heaven is at hand
    - ii. Telling them that the Messiah had indeed come
  - C. What to do
    - i. Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers and cast out demons
    - ii. Don't receive anything from anyone

D. What to take

- i. Only what you need
- ii. No bags or extra clothes or extra sandals or staffs

II. Jesus warned them about what it would be like in ministry

A. Jesus was very honest with them

- i. Didn't want them to be surprised when hard things happen
- ii. Didn't want them to think that they had done something wrong because things were difficult

B. Like sheep among wolves

- i. People will try and hurt you
- ii. Will take you to court and accuse you and even flog you
- iii. They will hurt and punish you because of me

C. It is for His purpose

- i. To bear witness about Him wherever you go
- ii. Will get the opportunity to speak with important people (governors and kings) about Jesus

D. God will be with you

- i. He will give you the words to say
- ii. He will speak through us

E. Doesn't promise us an easy life as His followers - John 16:33

- i. It will be difficult at times
- ii. We will be hated for His Name's sake
- iii. But we can have hope in the midst of it
- iv. Jesus has overcome the world on our behalf
  - a. Conquered evil, death and sin

### III. So What??!!

- A. We need to be prepared for this life to be hard
  - i. Being follower of Jesus invites hard times - John 15:18
  - ii. Need to not think that being a Christian makes life easy
- B. Jesus will be with us through it all
  - i. Don't have to face it alone
  - ii. Jesus sent the disciples out 2 x 2
    - a. Need to have Christian friends in our life to walk through things with
  - iii. Need to stay connected to Him and His Word
    - a. Give us truth and hope during hard times

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## JOHN 6:25-40

### Context

- Jesus has come to spread the Kingdom of God
- Jesus has had a ministry of teaching and healing that has impacted many people
- Crowds routinely gathered around Jesus and followed Him wherever He went
- Jesus had just fed the 5,000 who had come out to hear His teaching
- Afterwards, Jesus sent the disciples ahead in the boat and Jesus walked on the water to get to them
- The next day the crowd was again looking for Jesus
- Jesus tells them that they were looking for food and not Him
- Jesus teaches them about Bread of Life

### Outline

- I. **The people find Jesus**
  - A. Had been looking for Him
  - B. Noticed that there was only 1 boat and Jesus didn't get in it
  - C. Curious as to how He crossed the sea
- II. **Jesus exposes their need**
  - A. You are seeking me because I fed you
  - B. Not because of the miracle but because your needs were met
  - C. They were hungry and wanted to be filled again
- III. **Jesus tells them how to be satisfied**
  - A. Don't labor for food that perishes
    - i. Would spend a lot of time and energy working for things of this world



- ii. Getting money and possessions
- iii. God isn't saying don't work
  - a. He understands that we need to work to survive
  - b. Wants us to labor more for that which will last
- B. Labor for food that endures to eternal life
  - i. Food that endures
    - a. Salvation
  - ii. Given to them by Son of Man
    - a. Not earned by hard work
    - b. Not bought with money
  - iii. The people ask what they must do
    - a. How do we do God's work?
  - iv. Jesus' response
    - a. The work of God is to believe in the One He sent
    - b. Our greatest work is to have faith
    - c. When we have faith it will change the way we live
      - 1. We will tell others of our hope
  - v. The people ask Jesus for a sign
    - a. Compare Him to Moses who gave them manna to eat daily
    - b. The people were satisfied daily with bread from heaven
    - c. Jesus reminds them the true source of the manna
      - 1. Not Moses but God

#### **IV. Jesus is the Bread of Life**

- A. Bread of God is He who comes down from heaven and gives life to the world
  - i. The purpose of Jesus—come and bring us eternal life with His death
  - ii. Like the bread fed to the crowd
    - a. Was chosen to come to Earth
    - b. Was blessed by God

- c. Was broken—the cross
  - d. Was shared- spread around the world so that those who believe can be filled
- B. Whoever comes to me shall not hunger
  - i. Jesus is the One who truly satisfies
  - ii. We will have physical hunger again but we can find rest for our souls
    - a. Jesus fulfills our deepest needs and longings
  - iii. Jesus came not to do His will but God's will
    - a. To lose none that God has given Him
    - b. To take care of and protect God's people
    - c. To raise them up on the last day and bring them to heaven
      - 1. For all who look on Jesus and truly believe
      - 2. Believe He is the Son of God who came and lived a perfect life for our sakes and then died to take away our sin and rose again to conquer death and take us home to heaven

V. So What??!!

- A. Jesus reminds us that the things of this world can't truly satisfy
  - i. No amount of money or possessions or power will truly make us feel whole
- B. Jesus offers Himself as the only thing that can truly satisfy us
  - i. Jesus can satisfy us because He gives us true hope and purpose
    - a. Hope—that this life isn't all there is
    - b. Purpose—we were made to share Him with others
- C. Jesus invites us to come and believe
  - i. We believe by taking Him
  - ii. Bread was to be eaten
    - a. We must allow Jesus truly into our lives
    - b. When we eat bread it becomes a part of us at the deepest level
    - c. Jesus must touch every area of our life

- D. Jesus promises to bring us home
  - i. If we truly believe
  - ii. Will raise us up on the last day

# MESSIAH

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## MATTHEW 16:13-20

### Context

- Jesus has come to spread the Kingdom of God
- Crowds gathered around Jesus because of His teaching and the miracles He performed
- At the same time, Jesus was training His disciples in how to do ministry and helping them grow in their own faith
- Jesus has met opposition from religious leaders who are jealous of His popularity
- Jesus wants to find out what the crowds are saying about Him

### Outline

- I. **Jesus takes the disciples to Caesarea Philippi**
  - A. Was 25 miles north of Sea of Galilee
  - B. Had been a center for false worship of gods—Baal, Pan and now worship of Caesar as a god
  - C. Was a place that had a lot of opinions about who god is
- II. **Jesus asks the disciples a question**
  - A. Who do the people say that I am?
  - B. Wanted to know what the crowds thought about Him
    - i. This was before TV and the internet and instant news and communication
    - ii. Were they confused like the people of this city?
    - iii. Do they think I am just a good teacher or a nice guy?
    - iv. Have they made the connections between what I have done and who I am?
  - C. They answered His question
    - i. Some say John the Baptist
      - a. Thought they were the same person just doing different things

- ii. Some say Elijah
  - a. If you remember, Elijah didn't die but was taken up into heaven
  - b. They believed that Elijah had come back
- iii. Some say Jeremiah or one of the prophets
  - a. They recognized that He was a great teacher whose words had power
- D. Basically, the people still didn't get it
  - i. They tried to put Jesus in a box that they could understand
  - ii. Make Him less unique and just like something they have seen before

**III. Jesus asks them a more personal question**

- A. Who do YOU say that I am?
- B. This would have been a very important moment
  - i. Had they been listening and paying attention
  - ii. Did they really believe that Jesus was who He said He was
- C. Peter responds
  - i. You are the Christ
    - a. Means "Messiah" or "Anointed One"
    - b. Was the person the Jews had long awaited for
    - c. Fulfillment of all the Old Testament prophecies
    - d. The One who would come and free them
    - e. The Son of the Living God
    - f. Jesus is the Son
      - 1. Came directly from God
      - 2. Perfectly God
      - 3. Is to be worshipped
    - g. Of the Living God
      - 1. Not a dead god that they worshipped in that city
      - 2. The God is living and active in everyday life
      - 3. The One who is in control of all of human history



#### IV. Jesus' response

- A. He was excited that Peter got it
  - i. Blessed are you Peter
  - ii. This came from God and not from you
    - a. We can't truly know who Jesus is without God's help
  - iii. Told Peter He would build His church on him and his faith of who Jesus was
- B. Told them not to tell anyone
  - i. WHY???
  - ii. At this time the people didn't understand about the Messiah
    - a. Were hoping for a military or political leader who would free them from Rome
  - iii. Jesus' time had not yet come
    - a. His purpose was not only for the crowds to know who He was
    - b. He came to DIE for the crowds and for you and me
    - c. After His death, He commanded the disciples to tell everyone

#### V. So What??!!

- A. We live in a time where people don't think very much about God
  - i. Worship money and success more than God
- B. It is important to know what people think about Jesus
  - i. We need to know what our friends think
  - ii. We need to know what people from other religions think
- C. It is very important for us to know what we believe about Jesus
  - i. We need to know what we believe
  - ii. It will help us to stand firm when we are challenged
- D. We are called to tell others who Jesus is
  - i. He is the One who saves
  - ii. He is the only way to heaven

# GLORIOUS

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## MATTHEW 17:1-8

### Context

- Jesus has come to spread the Kingdom of God
- Jesus has had a ministry of teaching and healing that has impacted many people
- Crowds routinely gathered around Jesus and followed Him wherever He went
- The people are wondering whether Jesus is the Christ because of His teaching and miracles
- The religious leaders are constantly opposing Jesus
- Peter confesses that Jesus is the Christ and then Jesus foretells about His death and resurrection
- The religious leaders and crowds have been asking for signs but instead Jesus has a sign for a few of His disciples

### Outline

- I. **Jesus brings Peter, James and John along for a special event**
  - A. Wanted them to see something very special
  - B. Go up to top of high mountain by themselves
- II. **Jesus is transfigured**
  - A. Fancy word that means change
    - i. Similar to a metamorphosis—from caterpillar to butterfly
  - B. The Glory that was inside of Him shone through
    - i. Jesus didn't reflect Glory but it came from within Him
    - ii. He is now showing the Glory He laid aside when He became flesh
      - a. John 17:5
  - C. His face shone like the sun

- i. Similar to Moses when He went on mountain to be with the Lord
  - a. Exodus 34:29-35
- ii. Think about what it's like to look up at the sun
- D. His clothes became white as light
  - i. Shows that His perfection also came from within
- E. Reminds us of who He truly is
  - i. He is from heaven and is perfect and full of Glory

### III. Moses and Elijah show up

- A. Moses represents the Law
  - i. Was the one through whom God gave the Law to His people
  - ii. Jesus fulfills the Law and its requirements
- B. Elijah represents the Prophets
  - i. Those who spoke on behalf of God to His people
  - ii. Jesus fulfills the promises given through the Prophets
    - a. Never leave or forsake us
    - b. By His wounds we are healed
- C. Jesus shows the disciples that He is greater than Moses and Elijah
  - i. Greater than Law and the Prophets
  - ii. Greater than all who had come before Him to Earth

### IV. God the Father shows up

- A. Appears in the form of a bright cloud
- B. Speaks to those on the mountain
  - i. This is my beloved Son with whom I am well pleased
    - a. Same thing He said at Jesus' baptism
  - ii. Adds something important- "Listen to Him"
    - a. Gives them a command
    - b. Need to listen to Jesus' words
      - 1. Not just be in awe with the sign He performed

**V. Disciples' response**

- A. They fell on their faces and were terrified
  - i. Knew the only proper response was worship
  - ii. Were afraid of what they were experiencing
  - iii. If we saw Jesus for who He really was, we too would fall down in fear
- B. Jesus tells them to rise and have no fear
  - i. Knows their feelings and answers them with gentleness
  - ii. Wanted them to remember this moment during difficult days
    - a. When Jesus died and they might doubt they can remember what they saw and heard

**VI. So What??!!**

- A. Jesus is from God
  - i. He is more than good teacher or miracle worker
  - ii. He is the SON OF GOD
  - iii. He not only has Glory but is Glory
- B. We are called to listen to Jesus
  - i. Need to remember who He is
  - ii. If He truly is the Son of God then we should listen and obey His words
  - iii. Need to know the Bible for ourselves
- C. Jesus will return in Glory one day
  - i. Revelation 19:11-16
  - ii. He will also make us glorious
  - iii. Make us new and perfect

#### IV. So What??!!

  - i. He has overcome darkness once and for all

# GOOD SHEPHERD

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## JOHN 10:1-18

### Context

- Jesus has come to spread the Kingdom of God
- Jesus has had a ministry of teaching and healing that has impacted many people
- Crowds routinely gathered around Jesus and followed Him wherever He went
- The people are wondering whether Jesus is the Christ because of His teaching and miracles
- The religious leaders continuously try to discredit Jesus by testing Him
- Jesus confronts the misconceptions in His day about sin and judgment
- Jesus heals a man born blind and does so on the Sabbath
- The religious leaders try to discredit Jesus by saying the man wasn't really blind and saying that Jesus didn't keep the Sabbath
- Jesus wants to paint for them a picture of God that is different than their expectations

### Outline

- I. Jesus uses language and pictures that the people can understand
  - A. Sheep, shepherds, gate, robbers, sheepfold
  - B. At this time many people had sheep for meat and wool as well as for sacrifices to the Lord
  - C. They would often keep their sheep in a small area next to the house marked off by a rock wall—sheep pen
  - D. There would be an entrance to go in and for the sheep to go out to graze
  - E. Many times there were robbers who would come and steal sheep so they would hire someone to stand guard

## II. Jesus as the Good Shepherd

- A. Shepherds were also very common at this time
  - i. Would often be the one responsible for the sheep of a whole town
  - ii. Would take care of them and protect them
  - iii. Was around the sheep daily and spent a lot of time with them
- B. Jesus as Shepherd
  - i. Were often misunderstood and not highly respected
    - a. Treated sheep almost like people
      - 1. Very tender and loving to them
      - 2. Took care of all of their needs
  - ii. Picture of God's care for us
    - a. Sheep were helpless without shepherd
    - b. Jesus came to be tender and loving to us
    - c. Jesus came to save us and protect us
  - iii. He calls to His sheep
    - a. Jesus calls out to us
    - b. As His sheep we can hear and recognize His voice
    - c. His sheep not only hear but follow His voice
  - iv. He knows His sheep and they know Him
    - a. Knows us intimately—every hair on our head- Matthew 10:30
    - b. Knows us fully and yet still loves us
    - c. He who knows us best still loves us most
  - v. He lays down His life for His sheep
    - a. Takes it to a new level
    - b. Willing to sacrifice and die for the good of the sheep
      - 1. Hired hand won't do that
      - 2. More concerned for their lives than the sheep

- c. Jesus died so that we may have life
  - 1. Willingly gave up His life for our sakes
- vi. Fulfillment of Ezekiel 34:11-16
  - a. Jesus searches for us
  - b. Jesus rescues us
  - c. Jesus gathers us
  - d. Jesus takes care of us
    - 1. Leads us to good pasture
    - 2. Binds up the injured
    - 3. Strengthens the weak

### III. Contrasting the bad shepherds

- A. The religious leaders at this time cared only for themselves
- B. Wanted to be followed by the people
- C. Wanted to protect their popularity so didn't like Jesus
- D. Fulfillment of Ezekiel 34:1-10

### IV. So What??!!

- A. We need to realize all that Jesus has done for us
  - i. He came after us when we were far from Him
  - ii. He rescued us from our sin
  - iii. He laid down His life so that we can be saved
  - iv. Shows His great love for us
- B. We are called to follow Him
  - i. We need to be able to hear His voice
    - a. Know His Word
  - ii. He has in mind the best for us in this world
    - a. Came that we can have life abundantly

and to see why that matters for us.

# REVEALER OF GOD'S HEART

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## LUKE 15:11-32

### Context

- Jesus has come to spread the Kingdom of God
- Crowds gathered around Jesus because of His teaching and the miracles He performed
- At the same time, Jesus was training His disciples in how to do ministry and helping them grow in their own faith
- Jesus has met opposition from the religious leaders who are jealous of His popularity among the people
- People from all walks of life were constantly coming up to Jesus and asking Him questions and just wanted to be around Him
- Jesus spent a lot of His teaching revealing to the people they didn't know about God's kingdom and about God's heart

### Outline

- I. Jesus had a very diverse crowd around Him
  - A. Tax collectors and "sinners"
    - i. People who the religious leaders looked down upon
    - ii. People who weren't welcome at the synagogue or temple
    - iii. They were very drawn to Jesus because He spent time with them and didn't look down on them
  - B. The Pharisees and scribes
    - i. These were the religious leaders at this time
      - a. They were teachers of the Law

- b. They ran the temple and all religious practices
  - c. Were very important people and had a lot of influence
- ii. Tried to discount Jesus because He allowed "sinners" to hang around Him
  - a. People they would never associate with
  - b. Said that He was a sinner because He hung around them

## II. Jesus taught to both crowds to show God's heart

### A. The first 2 parables

- i. Parable #1- Lost sheep
  - a. If a shepherd loses a sheep they would leave the flock to find the one that was lost
    - 1. A lost sheep is helpless by itself and would probably die
    - 2. Shepherd cares for his sheep—close bond
    - 3. Are the lost people in your midst not more valuable than a sheep?
  - b. Shepherd celebrates over the finding of the sheep
- ii. Parable #2- Lost coin
  - a. If someone loses a coin will they not search for it?
    - 1. Sweep up, light a lamp, look under furniture, etc.
    - 2. Are not the lost people in your midst more valuable than a coin?

### B. What do these parables tell us about God?

- i. He is the one who pursues us
- ii. Looks for that which is lost
- iii. Cares deeply about the things that are lost
  - a. Speaking to the "sinners"
    - 1. You are valuable to God
    - 2. You must repent
  - b. Speaking to the religious leaders
    - 1. Your focus should not just be on those just like you
    - 2. You need to be seeking after those who don't know me
    - 3. They only cared about those in church and not those outside of it

- iv. He rejoices when those who were lost are found
  - a. Heaven celebrates with those who repent
  - b. The angels and God throw a party in thankfulness when someone is saved
- C. The last parable- The Lost Son
  - i. Man had two sons and younger son asked for his inheritance
    - a. Basically telling the dad that he wished he was dead
    - b. Wanted what dad could provide more than dad
  - ii. Father gave the son the inheritance and son left
    - a. Lived a wild life and spent all that he had
    - b. Had to get a job feeding pigs just to survive
  - iii. Son decides to return home
    - a. Prepares a speech to earn back his father's favor
    - b. Willing to give up being a son to be a servant
  - iv. Dad responds to his son's return
    - a. His father saw him while he was still a long way off
      - 1. Means he was waiting for him and looking for him
      - 2. Expected him to return someday
    - b. Father ran to his son
      - 1. Men did not run at this time
      - 2. Was not dignified
      - 3. Could make you indecent
      - 4. Have to pull up your robe
    - c. Embraced him and kissed him
    - d. Restored him
      - 1. Gave him robe—covered his dirtiness
      - 2. Gave him a ring
      - 3. Was signet ring
      - 4. Meant he could do business as part of family
      - 5. How they signed things back then

- e. Gave him sandals
  - 1. Many servants didn't have sandals
- f. Throws a party for his son
  - 1. His son was dead and is now alive
- v. The older brother
  - a. Heard about the party but wouldn't go in
  - b. Was mad at dad for accepting the brother back after all he did
    - 1. Called him "this son of yours"
    - 2. Devoured your property with prostitutes
  - c. Tells dad about all he has done
    - 1. Slaved for you all these years
    - 2. Never disobeyed you
    - 3. You never gave me anything
  - d. Father responds
    - 1. Son you are always with me
    - 2. Reminds him who he is, a son
    - 3. Shows he loves him
    - 4. All I have is yours
    - 5. He has not withheld from him
    - 6. Will continue to provide for him
    - 7. It is right to celebrate what has happened
    - 8. Your brother was dead and now is alive
- D. What does this tell us about God?
  - i. God will give us the desire of our hearts even if it's not Him
  - ii. God stands ready to receive us when we repent and turn away from our sin
  - iii. God loves us extravagantly
    - a. Runs after us, throws His arms around us, Gives us all we need to cover our sin and shame, restores us to right relationship with Him, reminds us that we are His children
  - iv. God celebrates when the lost are saved

- v. God also loves those who think they are self-righteous
  - a. Speaking directly to religious leaders at that time
  - b. Believe they have earned God's favor by their works
  - c. Reminds them that they can never be good enough

- A. Came right after the Fall
- B. In the midst of hearing about the curses that go along with their sin, God gives Adam and Eve hope
  - i. Genesis 3:15—He will crush the head of the enemy

#### II. God's promise through Abraham

- A. Jesus came from Abraham's line
- B. Abraham was given a promise about his offspring
  - i. Genesis 22:17-18
    - a. Your offspring shall possess the gates of his enemies
      - 1. Will conquer the gates of death and hell
    - b. All the nations of the Earth will be blessed through your offspring
      - 1. Jesus saves the nations with His death
      - 2. In heaven there will be some from every tribe, tongue and nation
    - c. Jesus is that offspring

### III. God's promise through Jacob

- A. Numbers 24:17-19
  - i. Out of Jacob one will have dominion
  - ii. The offspring of Jacob will rule
- B. Jesus is that offspring

### IV. God's promise through David

- A. Psalm 132:11
  - i. He will set upon the throne the fruit of David
  - ii. One of David's descendants will reign
  - iii. Jesus is King of Kings
- B. Jeremiah 23:5-6
  - i. Branch of David will rule

### V. Jesus is rightful heir to throne of David and the Covenant Promises of Abraham

- A. Jesus is the fulfillment of all of God's Old Testament promises about the Messiah
  - i. 354 prophecies about Messiah from the Old Testament that Jesus fulfills

### VI. So What??!!

- A. Jesus is the One that God had spoken about for generations
  - i. The One who would free us from our sins
  - ii. The One who would conquer sin and death
  - iii. The One who would be a blessing to the Nations
- B. We have access to that Jesus
  - i. We get to talk to the King of the Universe when we pray
  - ii. We get the opportunity to know Him better through His Word
- C. We get the chance to share His truth with others
  - i. Tell others about how great He is
  - ii. Point others to all the promises He fulfilled in Scripture

### Context

- Jesus has come to spread the Kingdom of God
- At the beginning of his gospel, John is writing to a varied audience that includes Greeks
- John specifically refers to an important Greek concept—Logos

### Outline

- I. **Logos**
  - A. Greek for Word
  - B. In Greek culture was meant to identify the highest truth
    - i. The reason for existence
  - C. In Jewish culture, Word had a very powerful place
    - i. They held high value on the spoken word
    - ii. Blessings and curses from God and others
  - D. John uses Logos to refer to Jesus
- II. **In the beginning was the Word**
  - A. Connects directly to Genesis—"In the beginning..."
  - B. Before Creation, the Word existed
- III. **The Word was with God and the Word was God**
  - A. The Word is a distinct entity from God

  - C. The Word is made of the same substance as God
    - i. Allows us to clearly see who God is

- D. Where our thoughts on Trinity come from
  - i. God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit

**IV. All things were made through Him**

- A. Jesus had a very important purpose in Creation
  - i. God worked through the Word to create
  - ii. Nothing was made without Him
- B. This is His world because He made it

**V. The Word became flesh**

- A. One of the most important concepts in all of Scripture
  - i. Incarnation
  - ii. The Word put on flesh
- B. Purposefully limited Himself with humanity
  - i. Became part of time and space
  - ii. Became just like us
    - a. Can understand the struggles and frustrations of human life
  - iii. Took on all the weakness and helplessness of a human and even more a baby
  - iv. Gave up His rights and throne for our sake
    - a. Philippians 2:5-7

**VI. And made His dwelling among us**

- A. Came to take up residence with us
- B. Point back to the days when God's Presence lived with Israel in the Tabernacle and the Temple
  - i. The Word now has an address
- C. We can now know God clearly and personally through the example of the Word

**I. So What??!!**

- A. Jesus gave up heaven in order to die for us
  - i. Gave up all He deserved in order to suffer and struggle like we do
  - ii. Willingly did it for our sake to glorify the Father

- B. Jesus is the Truth
  - i. The Word of Truth
  - ii. The only absolute in this world
- C. Jesus knows this world because He made it
  - i. Understands how it works best
  - ii. Came to show us the Father and help us see how we are to love and worship Him

- Matthew then describes how Jesus was born

### Outline

- I. It starts with a young couple- Mary and Joseph
  - A. Mary is betrothed to Joseph
    - i. They are promised to be married to each other
    - ii. She was just a common and ordinary Jewish girl
    - iii. She is told by an angel that she will have a baby that will come directly from God
    - iv. Would be a very hard situation for her to be in
  - B. Joseph is a just and humble man
    - i. Told he is a carpenter
    - ii. Was not rich by any means
      - a. Brought the sacrifice that the poor were allowed to bring when they brought baby Jesus to temple to be dedicated
    - iii. Joseph could have had Mary killed
      - a. Decides to not bring her shame
      - b. Wants to divorce her quietly
    - iv. An angel comes to him and tells him the truth
      - a. The baby is God's

- b. He will be the fulfillment of Scripture
  - 1. Will save the people from their sins
  - 2. Isaiah 7:14
- C. These were two nobodies from nowhere
  - i. No money or power or position
  - ii. Not who you would expect to become parents of the Son of God

## II. Jesus' birth

- A. God was orchestrating the events for His purposes
  - i. Had Caesar declare a census
  - ii. Forced Mary and Joseph to Bethlehem
- B. Jesus was born in a stable
  - i. No room for Him anywhere to be born
  - ii. Born among the animals in a very dirty place
  - iii. Not how you would expect a king to be born
- C. Jesus' birth went mostly unnoticed
  - i. No fanfare or processions for Him
  - ii. Some shepherds and foreign wise men came to see what they had been told
- D. Jesus' birth shows His humility
  - i. Lived a common life with common people
  - ii. Philippians 2
    - a. Did not hold on to His rights as God's Son
    - b. Made Himself nothing
    - c. Took form of a servant

## III. So What??!!

- A. Jesus humbly obeyed God
  - i. Went where He was told and how He was told
  - ii. Wanted to be about the Father's will
  - iii. Set an example for us to follow



- B. Jesus was like us
  - i. Didn't live the life of a king but a normal person at that time
  - ii. Gave up all He deserved in order to live the lives we couldn't live for ourselves
  - iii. Understands the lives we live

## JOHN 11:1-45

### Context

- Jesus has come to spread the Kingdom of God
- Crowds gathered around Jesus because of His teaching and the miracles He performed
- At the same time, Jesus was training His disciples in how to do ministry and helping them grow in their own faith
- Jesus has met opposition from the religious leaders who are jealous of His popularity among the people
- People from all walks of life were constantly coming up to Jesus and asking Him questions and just wanted to be around Him
- Jesus had many followers and many others who supported His ministry
- One family that He was particularly close to was Mary, Martha and Lazarus

### Outline

- I. **Jesus learns of Lazarus' illness**
  - A. Heard from Mary and Martha that he was very sick
  - B. They were asking Him to come and help
  - C. Jesus didn't leave immediately but waited two more days
    - i. Told the disciples that it would not end in death
    - ii. Knew it was another opportunity to glorify God
- II. **Jesus decides to go to Judea**
  - A. Disciples were afraid
    - i. The Jews and religious leaders had it out for Jesus
    - ii. Had tried to stone Him and wanted to kill Him

- B. Jesus tells them that Lazarus has died and that's why they are going
- C. Disciples decide to follow Jesus even though they think they will die also

### III. Jesus arrives at Bethany

- A. Lazarus had been buried for four days
  - i. Many had come to comfort Mary and Martha
- B. Mary and Martha go to meet Jesus
  - i. First Martha goes
    - a. Says to Jesus "Lord if you had been here my brother would not have died"
      - 1. Trying to understand what took Jesus so long
      - 2. Why did he have to die?
    - b. Also believed that Jesus could do something now
      - 1. Whatever you ask of God He will give you
    - c. Jesus' response- He will rise again
      - 1. I am the Resurrection and the Life
      - 2. Answered her questions
    - d. Martha affirms that Jesus is Messiah and Son of God
  - ii. Mary comes next
    - a. Had waited at the house at first
    - b. Martha had told her that Jesus was asking for her
    - c. Says to Jesus "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died"
      - 1. Exactly what Martha said
      - 2. She fell at His feet crying
      - 3. Jesus responds very differently to Mary than Martha
- C. Jesus responds to the sadness around Him
  - i. Saw Mary weeping and those with her weeping
  - ii. Jesus was deeply moved in spirit and greatly troubled
  - iii. Jesus wept
    - a. Shortest verse in English Bible but one of most powerful

D. Why did Jesus weep?

- i. He knew that He was going to raise Lazarus in a few minutes
- ii. Shows that He cares deeply about our pain
  - a. He feels our hurts and disappointments
  - b. He shares in our sufferings
- iii. Shows how unnatural death is
  - a. Was not how life was supposed to work
  - b. Death came with the Fall
  - c. Reminder of why Jesus came
    - 1. To free us from death

IV. Jesus shows His power

- A. Went to the tomb where Lazarus was
- B. Told them to take away the stone that sealed it
  - i. Was not typically done because dead bodies smelled bad
  - ii. Says "Did I not tell you that if you believed you would see the glory of God?"
- C. Jesus spoke to God
  - i. Lifted His eyes to heaven
  - ii. Wanted the people to know that power came from God
- D. Jesus spoke to Lazarus
  - i. Come out
  - ii. Showed His power over even death
    - a. The one thing that always wins
    - b. Was most people's biggest fear
  - iii. Lazarus comes out still bound in the grave clothes
    - a. To show that it wasn't someone else pretending to be Lazarus coming out
- E. Many believed in Him because of this miracle

V. So What??!!

- A. Jesus is way more powerful than you think

- i. If He can bring someone back from the dead, He can handle the little concerns in your life
  - ii. Jesus has power over death
- B. Jesus cares more than you think
  - i. Weeps with you when you weep
  - ii. Is broken over the effects of sin on your life and in this world
  - iii. Shows great love and compassion to us
- C. Jesus answers in His timing in order to glorify God
  - i. Waited for Lazarus to die
    - a. The sisters did not understand or like it
    - b. Had to trust that God's plan was better
  - ii. Jesus works in our lives in His timing
    - a. Ultimate goal is for us to trust God more
    - b. Brings Glory to Himself even in way He acts and not just what He does

# LOVING

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## MARK 10:13-22

### Context

- Jesus has come to spread the Kingdom of God
- Crowds gathered around Jesus because of His teaching and the miracles He performed
- At the same time, Jesus was training His disciples in how to do ministry and helping them grow in their own faith
- Jesus has met opposition from the religious leaders who are jealous of His popularity among the people
- People from all walks of life were constantly coming up to Jesus and asking Him questions

### Outline

- I. **The crowds were bringing children to Jesus**
  - A. People wanted Jesus simply to touch their children
  - B. Believed that even Jesus' touch was full of blessing
  - C. Disciples rebuked the people
    - i. Saw children as a distraction
    - ii. Children were not very important in those days
      - a. They didn't really bring anything to society
      - b. Were needy and not very helpful yet
      - c. Became valuable once they were able to contribute
    - iii. Felt this was a waste of Jesus' time
      - a. His time was too precious to be "wasted" on children
  - D. Jesus rebukes the disciples
    - i. Let them come and don't hinder them

- ii. Saw the children as very valuable
  - iii. They were also part of God's kingdom
  - iv. They have the ability to demonstrate faith in a way that adults don't- verse 15
  - v. Made them as valuable as He was
  - vi. Mark 9:36-37
- E. Jesus showed love to the children and the parents
- i. Was not too busy for them
  - ii. Spent time with them and laid hands on them
  - iii. Let them know that He loved them

**II. A man comes to Jesus on his own**

- A. Calls Jesus Good Teacher
- i. Was sign of respect
  - ii. Jesus questions him to see if it means what he says
    - a. Only God is good, so do you believe that I am God
- B. Man asks what he MUST DO to get eternal life
- i. Instead of trusting like a child he asks what he can do to earn heaven
  - ii. Wants the bare minimum
    - a. What MUST I do
- C. We are told that he is an important man
- i. Luke 18:18 tells us he is a ruler and we will see that he is also rich
  - ii. Very different than the children that Jesus had just encountered
  - iii. Would be someone you would want to be on your team
  - iv. Had money, power and influence but still was missing something
- D. Jesus responds to him
- i. You know what to do, obey all the commandments
    - a. Gives him an impossible standard—be perfect
    - b. The only way we can earn our way into heaven is to be perfect and never sin, there is no other way to do it alone

- ii. The man claims perfection
  - a. All these I have kept since I was young
  - b. Was either lying or very confused
- iii. Jesus would have every right to be angry

# COMPASSIONATE

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## MATTHEW 20:29-34

### Context

- Jesus has come to spread the Kingdom of God
- Crowds gathered around Jesus because of His teaching and the miracles He performed
- At the same time, Jesus was training His disciples in how to do ministry and helping them grow in their own faith
- Jesus has met opposition from the religious leaders who are jealous of His popularity among the people
- People from all walks of life were constantly coming up to Jesus and asking Him questions and just wanted to be around Him
- Jesus had predicted His death three times and was on His way to Jerusalem to die

### Outline

- I. Jesus was leaving Jericho on His way to Jerusalem
  - A. His time had come to fulfill His purpose
  - B. Would be His last week on Earth
- II. There were two blind men on the side of the road
  - A. Being blind often meant you were poor and alone
    - i. This was before Braille and seeing eye dogs
      - a. People didn't know how to take care of someone who was blind
    - ii. Blind people didn't contribute to society—couldn't have a job
      - a. Their only hope of survival was to sit on the road and beg for food and money from those who passed by
      - b. They would often sit at city or gate or temple because that is where people walked the most

- iii. Being blind was seen as a curse from God
  - a. People thought blindness was a result of sin of either the person or their parents
  - b. Made them outcasts from the temple
- B. These men had clearly heard about Jesus
  - i. Called Him Lord and Son of David
    - a. These were titles of the Messiah
    - b. Had heard of His teaching and miracles
  - ii. Believed that Jesus could heal them
    - a. "Have mercy on us"
    - b. Cried out in a loud voice trying to get Jesus' attention
    - c. Wouldn't give up calling to Him
- C. Crowd's response
  - i. Rebuked the blind men
    - a. Jesus had "important" things to do
    - b. He didn't need to be bothered by insignificant people like these two
    - c. Just found the blind men frustrating and annoying
  - ii. Told them to be quiet
    - a. Had no compassion on them and their need
- D. Jesus' response
  - i. Jesus stopped
    - a. Was on His way to fulfill His mission so no one would blame Him if He continued on
    - b. Knew there was nothing more important to do at this time than help these men
    - c. Jesus showed that they had value regardless of what the world thought
  - ii. Jesus asked them a question—"What do you want me to do for you?"
    - a. Jesus spoke to them
      - 1. Could have just healed on His way by without stopping
      - 2. He truly cared about them
    - b. Seems like an odd question

- c. Would seem obvious that they want to see
- d. Why ask it?
  - 1. If they got their sight back everything would change
  - 2. Would have responsibilities and need a job
  - 3. Couldn't just rely on others to take care of them
- iii. Jesus healed them
  - a. He had pity on them
    - 1. Was deeply moved by their struggle and their faith
    - 2. Saw to their deepest need
  - b. He touched their eyes
    - 1. How long had it been since someone touched them
    - 2. How long had it been since someone stopped and paid attention to them at all
  - c. They IMMEDIATELY regained their sight
    - 1. Nothing they had to do or say
    - 2. Jesus shows His power
- E. The blind men's response
  - i. They followed Jesus
  - ii. Many people get what they want from Jesus and then go on their way
    - a. Pray for things and forget to thank Him when He answers
    - b. Only want what Jesus provides instead of wanting Him
    - c. They find Jesus useful but not beautiful

### III. So What??!!

- A. There are needy people around us all the time
  - i. People the world says aren't important
  - ii. People who need Jesus in their lives
  - iii. It is easier for us to ignore them than to care

- B. We are also needy
  - i. We have places where we are hurting as well
  - ii. We aren't perfect and don't have it all together
- C. Jesus shows us how to have compassion on those in need
  - i. We need to look and listen for them
    - a. Easy to be too busy or just turn a blind eye
  - ii. We need to talk to them
    - a. Most people desire a relationship more than stuff
  - iii. We need to help them
    - a. If we are able

# FRIEND OF SINNERS

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## LUKE 19:1-10

### Context

- Jesus has come to spread the Kingdom of God
- Crowds gathered around Jesus because of His teaching and the miracles He performed
- At the same time, Jesus was training His disciples in how to do ministry and helping them grow in their own faith
- Jesus has met opposition from the religious leaders who are jealous of His popularity
- People from all walks of life were constantly coming up to Jesus and asking Him questions and just wanted to be around Him
- Jesus had predicted His death three times and was on His way to Jerusalem to die

### Outline

- I. **Jesus was passing through Jericho on His way to Jerusalem**
  - A. Jericho was a major city at this time
    - i. Housed the winter palace for Herod the Great
    - ii. Was an important stopping place for many travelers
      - a. Tolls and taxes would have been collected on goods going East and West
  - B. Jesus purposefully went to Jericho
    - i. Were many different paths that led from Capernaum to Jerusalem
    - ii. We see God directing His steps along the way
      - a. Luke 9:51-56
      - b. Village didn't allow Jesus to pass through
- II. **Zacchaeus**
  - A. Chief tax collector of Jericho

- i. Only time we see this title in the New Testament
  - ii. Tax collectors were usually untrustworthy and greedy
    - a. Only they knew the amount of taxes someone owed
    - b. They would tell the people that they actually owed more tax than they did and keep the rest for themselves
- B. Was rich
- i. Had made a very good living off of the people of Jericho
  - ii. Was not well liked by the people in town because they knew he cheated them
- C. Wanted to see Jesus
- i. Word about Jesus and His power and teaching had reached Jericho
  - ii. Because he was small and crowd was big, Zacchaeus climbed a tree just to see Jesus
  - iii. He did things that gentlemen of this time typically didn't do
    - a. Ran and climbed a tree

### **III. Instead Jesus sees Zacchaeus**

- A. Jesus stopped at the tree where Zacchaeus was
- i. Of all the people in the crowd, Jesus wanted to talk with him
- B. Jesus spoke to Zacchaeus
- i. Hurry and come down
    - a. Didn't want him to wait
  - ii. I MUST stay at your house today
    - a. To fulfill God's plan, Jesus had to go with Zacchaeus

### **IV. Zacchaeus has Jesus over**

- A. He received Jesus joyfully
- i. Probably didn't have many guests wanting to come to his house
- B. The crowds are not happy about this
- i. They didn't like Jesus' choice
    - a. Saw Zacchaeus as a sinner because of his job
    - b. Didn't recognize that they were sinners also

- ii. They grumbled
  - a. It's easy to complain when God doesn't do what we want Him to do
- C. Jesus had a major impact on Zacchaeus
  - i. Zacchaeus repented of his sins
    - a. More than just being sorry but being different
    - b. Would pay back four times any money he had cheated people out of
    - c. Would become someone the people could trust again
  - ii. Zacchaeus wanted to follow Jesus
    - a. Believed who Jesus was—Savior
    - b. Would give half his money to the poor
    - c. Showed that Jesus was more important than money
  - iii. "Salvation has come to this house"
    - a. Jesus acknowledges that Zacchaeus is now saved
- V. **Jesus tells His mission**
  - A. The Son of Man came
    - i. Jesus left heaven to be with us
    - ii. Jesus made all the effort for our sakes
  - B. To seek
    - i. Jesus pursues
    - ii. Wants us to know Him
  - C. And save the lost
    - i. Jesus seeks after those who don't know Him
    - ii. Came to those who needed Him
      - a. Came not to call righteous but sinners
    - iii. Wants us to continue His pursuit of the lost
      - a. To find those who don't know Jesus and tell them about Him
- VI. **So What??!!**
  - A. We often look at other people's sins instead of dealing with our own

- i. "At least I am better than that person"
- ii. Need to look at our own lives and see our sin
- B. Jesus wants us to be with Him now
  - i. We like to make excuses or put Jesus off for later
    - a. "When I am older I will follow Jesus"
  - ii. Jesus wants us today and every day
- C. Jesus wants to use us for His mission
  - i. See people as Jesus sees them
    - a. Not avoid people who are different or who are sinners
    - b. Be willing to be with people who need Jesus
    - c. Care more what Jesus thinks than what the crowd thinks
  - ii. Share Jesus with others
    - a. We have a unique story of God's grace to tell
    - b. Need to share God's love with those who don't know

# FULFILLMENT OF PROPHECY

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## MATTHEW 21:1-11

### Context

- Jesus has come to spread the Kingdom of God
- Jesus has had a ministry of teaching and healing that has impacted many people
- Crowds routinely gathered around Jesus and followed Him wherever He went
- The people are wondering whether Jesus is the Christ because of His teaching and miracles
- Jesus' time has come and He goes to Jerusalem to fulfill His purpose by dying on the cross

### Outline

- I. **Jesus is preparing for His last week on Earth**
  - A. Makes plans to celebrate the Passover
    - i. Sent two disciples on ahead to make arrangements
    - ii. God had already had the whole thing planned out
      - a. You will find a donkey with her colt; bring them to me
      - b. Say "The Lord needs them"
- II. **Jesus enters the city**
  - A. He rides in on the donkey
  - B. Shows He is a king
    - i. A king riding in for battle rode a horse
    - ii. A King riding in peace rode a donkey
    - iii. He is coming to bring peace to Jerusalem and the whole world

### III. The people respond

- A. Put their cloaks on the road for Him to ride over
  - i. Would have been a costly offering for them
    - a. Many didn't have extra clothes
    - b. Would have gotten very dirty
    - c. Was an act of worship
- B. Put branches down before Him
  - i. The Jews would put down palms at the feet of victorious Kings
  - ii. Demonstrating His ultimate victory
- C. Shouted as an act of worship of Jesus
  - i. Hosanna to the Son of David
    - a. Meant "O Save" or "Save Now"
    - b. Calling out to Jesus to save them
    - c. Acknowledges Him as the Davidic King
  - ii. Blessed is He who comes in the Name of the Lord
    - a. Acknowledging that Jesus did not come by Himself but was sent by God
    - b. Knew that He had come to be a blessing
- D. The whole city was stirred up wondering who Jesus was
  - i. Knew that what had happened was a fulfillment of prophecy
  - ii. Knew that it symbolized the coming of the Messiah

### IV. The fulfillment of prophecy about the Messiah

- A. Riding in on the donkey
  - i. Zechariah 9:9
  - ii. Isaiah 62:11
- B. Shows that He is King
  - i. 2 Kings 9:13
- C. Shouts of Hosanna
  - i. Psalm 118:25-26

- D. Jesus demonstrates who He really is
  - i. The Jews would understand what He was doing
  - ii. Had been looking for the Messiah to come
- E. Jesus fulfilled over 350 prophecies from the Old Testament
  - i. Words written hundreds and thousands of years before He came to Earth
  - ii. The chances of 1 person even fulfilling 8 prophecies is 1 in 100,000,000,000,000,000
- V. **So What??!!**
  - A. Jesus is the Messiah that was promised
    - i. He fulfills all the predictions about the One who was to come
    - ii. Because He is the Messiah, we are called to believe in Him and obey Him
  - B. Shows that God had a plan all along
    - i. Means we can trust Him and the plan He has for our life

and to see why that matters for us.

# PROTECTOR OF WORSHIP

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**MARK 11:15-19**

## Context

- Jesus has come to spread the Kingdom of God
- Jesus has had a ministry of teaching and healing that has impacted many people
- Crowds routinely gathered around Jesus and followed Him wherever He went
- Jesus' time has come and he goes to Jerusalem to fulfill His purpose by dying on the cross
- Jesus enters the city to a crowd shouting Hosanna
- Jesus' first order of business is to go to the temple

## Outline

- I. The problem with the temple
  - A. Jesus shows up at the temple and was frustrated by what He saw
  - B. The temple was the center of worship in Jerusalem
    - i. Especially during this time as people travelled to celebrate the Passover
    - ii. For many it was the one time of year they came to God's temple
  - C. The temple had become corrupt
    - i. Pigeon sellers
      - a. When someone came to the temple they had to bring a sacrifice
      - b. The sacrifice had to be completely perfect
      - c. Many people travelled a long way which meant that something could happen to their sacrifice on the journey
      - d. Therefore people would sell sacrifices to those who came

- e. Pigeons were the sacrifice for the poorest people who didn't have enough to offer a lamb
- f. They would charge high prices because people had to have a sacrifice and there was nowhere else to get one
- ii. Money changers
  - a. Everyone was required to pay a temple tax every year
    - 1. Was used to provide for priests
    - 2. Was used for upkeep of temple
  - b. The temple required that the taxes were paid using the temple currency
  - c. It was also used to buy the sacrifices
  - d. It was not used at any other time
  - e. The moneychangers would charge extra money to change the money over
- iii. Location of all of this
  - a. The sellers and moneychangers set up in the outer courts
  - b. This area was the part of the temple where non-Jews could come and worship and pray
  - c. Imagine how distracting it would be to try and worship in the midst of all of this
- iv. The temple had become a place where people were cheated instead of being able to worship God

## II. Jesus' response

- A. Drove out those who were making money
  - i. Turned over their tables
  - ii. Told them that they had made the temple a den of robbers
    - a. Was fulfillment of prophecy - Jeremiah 7:11
- B. Wanted to restore the temple to its purpose
  - i. The worship of God
  - ii. Wanted Gentiles to have a place of worship
  - iii. Wanted the poor to be able to worship and sacrifice without being cheated



### III. The response of the people

- A. Chief priests and scribes
  - i. Wanted to kill Jesus
  - ii. Were afraid of Him
  - iii. Scared that the crowd would go after Him
- B. The crowds were amazed
  - i. No one taught like this
  - ii. No one seemed to care about people like Jesus did
    - a. Even those that the world saw as unimportant
  - iii. He really cared about worship more than Himself

### IV. So What??!!

- A. Jesus cares deeply about worship
  - i. We are called to glorify God
  - ii. Worship is the natural response to all God has done for us
  - iii. Jesus wants to get rid of all the things that prevent us from worshipping God
- B. Jesus was willing to stand up for what He believed in
  - i. Would have brought a lot of attention
  - ii. Many might not like Jesus anymore because of what He did
  - iii. The religious leaders wanted to kill Him in response to this
- C. Jesus looked out for those who couldn't look out for themselves
  - i. Cared for the poor and the outcasts
  - ii. Wanted them to know that God loved them too

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## JOHN 13:1-16

### Context

- Jesus has come to spread the Kingdom of God
- Jesus has had a ministry of teaching and healing that has impacted many people
- Crowds routinely gathered around Jesus and followed Him wherever He went
- The people are wondering whether Jesus is the Christ because of His teaching and miracles
- Jesus' time has come and He goes to Jerusalem to fulfill His purpose by dying on the cross
- Jesus is now with His disciples in the Upper Room sharing their last meal together the night before He is to die
- Jesus wants to make sure that they understand who He really is and why He really came before He goes to the cross

### Outline

- I. Jesus does something radical
  - A. Feet were very dirty
    - i. People would walk around wherever they went
      - a. No cars or bikes
      - b. Had animals that were used mostly to farm
    - ii. They wore sandals
    - iii. Whole foot wasn't covered
    - iv. Streets were made of dirt
    - v. Animals would often relieve themselves on the road
    - vi. Feet would be nasty and smelly at end of the day
  - B. People washed their feet before they entered somewhere

- i. As a sign of respect they would clean their feet
    - a. Especially if you were a guest in someone's home
  - ii. People would often have servants clean their guests' feet
    - a. Because they were disgusting
    - b. Was the lowest servant of the house
      - 1. No dignity or respect; looked down on by other servants
- C. Jesus washes the disciples' feet
- i. Took off His outer garment
  - ii. Got down on His knees
  - iii. Cleaned off all the dirt from their feet and wiped them with a towel
  - iv. The disciples didn't know what to think
    - a. Peter protests at first
    - b. Peter then wants Jesus to give him a bath
  - v. Jesus puts Himself as the lowest servant
    - a. Typically the teacher was the highest person
    - b. Everyone served them and not the other way around
  - vi. Does this for ALL the disciples
    - a. Even Judas who He knew would betray Him
    - b. Lives out "Love your enemies"

## II. Why does Jesus do this?

- A. Show them the full extent of His love
  - i. Jesus wants to give them a picture of how much He loves them
  - ii. Would humble Himself to do such a selfless act for them
  - iii. Wanted them to not doubt His love when He died and they were confused
- B. Because He was secure in who He was—verse 3
  - i. Knew who He was—the Son
    - a. "The Father had..."
    - b. Knew that He belonged to God

- ii. Knew His purpose
  - a. "Given all things into His hand"
  - b. God had given these guys and this ministry to Jesus
  - c. Knew that He had come to die and this was His last chance
- iii. Knew His hope
  - a. "Was going back to God"
  - b. Even though He was going to suffer He knew in the end He would be back with God the Father
- iv. Allowed Him to serve others
  - a. Often we don't serve because of our insecurity
    - 1. Worry what others will think
  - b. Jesus' confidence in who He was gave Him the freedom to serve them in an elaborate way
- C. To give them an example for later
  - i. They were to be people who served others
    - a. Other religious leaders demanded to be served
    - b. The disciples would be the leaders of the church
    - c. Were to never lose sight of who Jesus called them to be—servants
  - ii. Not trying to have positions of power but willing to serve
    - a. If their master served then so should they
      - 1. No excuses
    - b. Be an example to the rest of the Church

### III. So What??!!

- A. Because Jesus served so should we
  - a. Shouldn't think of ourselves as better than anyone
  - b. There should be nothing that is too good for us to do
  - c. Need to look for ways to serve those we are around
  - d. We need to be humble leaders and not prideful



- B. We need to remember who we are
  - i. Child of God
  - ii. Called to love, serve and share the Gospel
  - iii. Have secure hope: heaven

## III. I am the TRUTH

- A. There are not many truths but only one
  - i. Truth is not relative or subjective
  - ii. God has ABSOLUTE TRUTH
- B. To truly understand God or the world we must know what Jesus said
  - i. He is One with God
  - ii. He created the heavens and the Earth
- C. Jesus leads us into all truth
  - i. Makes truth available for us to know
  - ii. We have His Word—the Bible

## IV. I am THE LIFE

- A. Not just one option of how to live
- B. He created life and this world so He knows how it works best
- C. Jesus doesn't want you to just exist and live but thrive
  - i. Lived a bold and exciting life

- D. Living for Jesus is the only life that truly satisfies
  - i. Sin and pleasure are fleeting
  - ii. This world and all its stuff will pass away
  - iii. Jesus gives us a way to be content no matter the circumstances

**V. Jesus embodies these things to show us God**

- A. Wants to make the Father known to us
- B. Shows us His heart for us
- C. Leads us to Him

**VI. So What??!!**

- A. Jesus is the ONLY way to heaven
  - i. Can't get there by ourselves
  - ii. Need to tell others
- B. Jesus is the ONLY absolute truth
  - i. Need to know and study His Word
  - ii. Need to use His Word when faced with temptations or difficult decisions

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## JOHN 15:1-11

### Context

- Jesus has had a ministry of teaching and healing that has impacted many people
- Crowds routinely gathered around Jesus and followed Him wherever He went
- The people are wondering whether Jesus is the Christ because of His teaching and miracles
- The religious leaders continuously try to discredit Jesus by testing Him
- Jesus confronts the misconceptions in His day about sin and judgment
- Jesus' time has come and he goes to Jerusalem to fulfill His purpose by dying on the cross
- Jesus enters the city to a crowd shouting Hosanna and then cleanses the Temple to the dismay of the religious leaders who are trying to kill Him
- Jesus is now with His disciples in the Upper Room sharing their last meal together the night before He is to die
- Jesus wants to make sure that they understand who He really is and why He really came before He goes to the cross

### Outline

- I. **Jesus gives them another picture they can relate to**
  - A. Vines and vinedressers
    - i. Grapes were a big part of the culture at this time
      - a. Used to eat and make wine
    - ii. Grape vines had to be taken care of
      - a. Needed to be pruned and trimmed often
      - b. If they were left to grow wild, they could choke off and not bear fruit

B. He uses this to show the relationship between Himself, God the Father, and us

- i. Vinedresser- God the Father
- ii. Vine- Jesus
- iii. Branches- Us

**II. What does the vinedresser do?**

A. Cuts off the branches that don't bear fruit

- i. Our call as Christians is to grow to be more like Jesus daily
- ii. Bear fruit in increasing measure
  - a. The longer you are a Christian the more growth you should see over the long haul
  - b. Showing the fruits of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23)

B. Prunes the branches that are bearing fruit to make them more fruitful

- i. Sometimes God needs to cut some things out of our lives so we can truly glorify Him more
  - a. Friends and relationships that don't honor Him
  - b. Activities and stuff that distract us from Him
  - c. Awards and accolades that would make us prideful
  - d. It can be really painful but it's worth it in the end
- ii. His goal is for us to bring glory to Him and not be successful in the eyes of the world

**III. What does the Vine do?**

A. It brings life to the branches

- i. Cannot live if they're not connected
- ii. Can't do anything on their own

B. It brings nutrients to the branches

- i. What they need to grow
- ii. What they need to bear fruit

C. Keeps the branches connected together

- i. Holds them together
- ii. Makes them a part of the whole

#### IV. Jesus as the True Vine

- A. In OT, the vine and vineyard referred to Israel- Isaiah 5:1-7
  - i. Where the blessings of God came from
  - ii. People needed to be grafted into Israel
  - iii. Had become symbol of Israel
- B. Jesus is the fulfillment of that
  - i. We are blessed not because we belong to Israel but belong to Jesus
  - ii. Aren't saved by being a Jew but by believing in Jesus

#### V. What do the Branches do?

- A. Bear fruit ONLY if they are connected to the vine
- B. Apart from the vine
  - i. They wither and die with nothing to feed them
  - ii. They are gathered and thrown into the fire
    - a. Have no real purpose

#### VI. How do we stay in the vine?

- A. Abide
  - i. Stay in constant contact with Jesus
  - ii. Keep in fellowship with Jesus so His life can work in and through you
- B. Obey
  - i. We abide in Jesus by obeying His commandments
  - ii. Jesus sets the example in His obedience to the Father
    - a. Became obedient to death, even death on a cross- Philippians 2:8
- C. Promises associated with this
  - i. Bear much fruit
  - ii. Have full joy

## VII. So What??!!

- A. We need to abide in Jesus
  - i. Get our strength and sustenance from Him
  - ii. Can't do the Christian life on our own
- B. We need to obey Jesus
  - i. Know His Words and His commands
  - ii. Not just know the Word but do it- James 1:22

- Jesus enters the city to a crowd shouting Hosanna and then cleanses the Temple to the dismay of the religious leaders who are trying to kill Him
- Jesus is now with His disciples in the Upper Room sharing their last meal together the night before He is to die
- Jesus wants to make sure that they understand who He really is and why He really came before He goes to the cross
- Jesus takes the time to spend time praying for the disciples before He dies

### Outline

- I. **Jesus often spent time in prayer**
  - A. Luke 5:16, Mark 1:35
  - B. Saw the importance of prayer for Him
    - i. Keeping Him connected to the Father
    - ii. Gave Him strength to serve and minister
- II. **Jesus wants the disciples to see the importance of prayer**
  - A. This is His last night on Earth and spends it praying with them
  - B. Demonstrates what to ask for—verses 1-5
    - i. Bring Glory to God

- a. Wanted His life to bring glory to God
- ii. By spreading the truth about eternal life
  - a. Knowing the only True God
  - b. Knowing Jesus who God sent
- C. Praying for the disciples—those with Him now

    - b. That Scripture would be fulfilled
  - iii. Keep them from the evil one
    - a. Not take them out of the world but help them stand up in it
  - iv. Sanctify them with Truth
    - a. That God's Word would make them more like Him
    - b. As they obey God's Word they will be more like Him
- D. Praying for us as well
  - i. Those who will believe in me through the Word
    - a. Jesus on His last night on Earth – prayer for you and me
  - ii. Prayed that we would be unified
    - a. All believers will be One as He and God the Father are One
    - b. So that the world will believe in Him
      - 1. John 13:35
  - iii. Prayed for us to go to heaven
    - a. To see Him in His glory and know Him deeply

### III. So What??!!

- A. If Jesus needed prayer then so do we
  - i. An important part of having a relationship with Him
  - ii. Prayer is what we need to be connected to follow and obey

- B. Prayer should be a priority in our lives
  - i. If Jesus prayed on His last night then we should also make prayer an important part of our lives
  - ii. Jesus would pray even when He was busy doing ministry
    - a. Made time to go and speak to God in prayer
- C. We should pray not only for ourselves but others
  - i. With all that Jesus was about to endure, no one would have blamed Him if He only prayed for Himself
  - ii. Jesus understood His call to pray for other people

    - a. They were only looking for Jesus

### IV. Jesus as I AM

- A. The soldiers ask for Jesus of Nazareth
- B. Jesus responds with "I am he"
- C. The whole crowd draws back and falls to the ground at Jesus' words
  - i. A show of immense power
  - ii. The power of even Jesus' words
- D. What does this mean?
  - i. I AM—Exodus 3
  - ii. God appears to Moses in burning bush
  - iii. Calls Him to go to His people and tell them that God has heard their cries and is freeing them

- iv. Moses asks, What if the people ask your Name? Who shall I say sent me?
  - v. God responds with a name—Yahweh
    - 1. I AM
    - 2. Tell them that I AM has sent me to you
    - 3. God's personal name to His people
    - 4. God's powerful name to His people
  - vi. Jesus uses the same name
    - a. Makes the connection between He and the Father
    - b. Shows the power in His Name
      - 1. At the mention of it all the people fall
- V. What does Jesus being I AM do for us?**
- A. Reminds us who Jesus is
    - i. More than just a man
    - ii. He is GOD—I AM
      - a. He deserves our worship
  - B. Reminds us that He is working now
    - i. Often think that God WAS working in past
      - a. Did miracles
      - b. Spoke to His people
    - ii. Often think God WILL BE working in the future
      - a. Take us to heaven
      - b. Making new heaven and new Earth
    - iii. God is working in our lives today- I AM
      - a. God is what we need now
        - 1. Healer, Teacher, Savior, Friend, etc.

    - b. Had the Truth
  - iv. Fulfills Scripture about Him
    - a. Isaiah 53:7
- B. Next, He gives them what they needed
  - i. If Jesus says nothing, they will have to free Him
    - a. No evidence
    - b. Would leave there free
  - ii. They ask Him, "Are you the Christ?"
    - a. Jesus says "I am"
    - b. Was the admission of guilt they needed
    - c. Meant they could charge Him with blasphemy
    - d. They all condemned Him because of His words
      - 1. Even began to spit on Him and hit Him

**IV. How could Jesus respond like this???**

- A. He trusted God's plan
  - i. Knew that God could be trusted
  - ii. Knew that God was in control
  - iii. Knew this was part of God's ultimate plan
    - a. Isaiah 53:10
- B. Knew what His purpose was—to die
  - i. John 18:36-37
  - ii. Knew what would happen to Him
  - iii. This was the reason He came
    - a. To suffer and die for our sakes
    - b. Be the offering for sin we needed
      - 1. Isaiah 53:4-6

**V. SO WHAT??!!!**

- A. We can also trust God
  - i. He is in control of our lives as well
  - ii. Knows what is best for us
    - a. He is Good
  - iii. Has a plan for us—Jeremiah 29:11
    - a. For our good
    - b. Give us a hope and a future
  - iv. Has a plan for all areas of life
  - v. Even when things aren't going the way we think they should
  - vi. God knows everything that is happening with us and around us
- B. We don't have to defend ourselves when we are obeying God
  - i. Exodus 14:14, Psalm 121:7
  - ii. Jesus is our defender
    - a. Protects and cares for us

  - A. Was Rome's most public and painful way to die
  - B. Was a fulfillment of Scripture
    - i. Galatians 3:13
    - ii. Psalm 22:18
  - C. He was not alone
    - i. Two criminals with Him
    - ii. One on either side

D. Crowd was watching

- i. Religious leaders
  - a. If He is the Christ let Him save Himself
- ii. Soldiers
  - a. If you are the King of the Jews save yourself

E. Was in agony

- i. Spikes driven into his hands and through His feet
- ii. Being ridiculed and made fun of by those He came to love and save

**II. Jesus shows His heart for forgiveness**

A. Towards the crowd and religious leaders

- i. They had called to crucify Him
- ii. They had made up testimony about Him
- iii. They had made fun of Him
- iv. They had spit on Him and beaten Him

B. Jesus prays for them

- i. Fulfillment of His instruction to the disciples
  - a. Matthew 5:44
- ii. Prays for God to forgive them
  - a. Imagine how radical that is
  - b. While they are being mean to Him and killing Him, He can only think about their need
  - c. Knew they didn't really understand what they were doing
  - d. Shows His love for all people

C. Towards the criminal

- i. One of the criminals was also hurling insults at Jesus
  - a. Are you not the Christ? Then save yourself and us
- ii. The other criminal rebuked him
  - a. Knew their punishment was deserved



- iii. Asks for Jesus' mercy
  - a. Believed Jesus was the Messiah
    - 1. Asked to be part of His Kingdom
  - b. Wanted Jesus just to remember him
- D. Jesus' promise to the robber
  - i. Truly
    - a. So he could know that Jesus would fulfill it
  - ii. I say to you
    - a. Speaking directly to him and not everyone
  - iii. Today
    - a. He would not have to wait it out
    - b. Wouldn't have to do some extra work because he was a criminal
  - iv. You will be with ME
    - a. Lets him know that Jesus will take him there personally
    - b. His Kingdom is being in His Presence
  - v. In paradise
    - a. Heaven
    - b. Perfection
  - vi. Despite the criminal's sin that was worthy enough to be killed for, Jesus is offering him grace, mercy and forgiveness for his past sins

### III. SO WHAT?!!!!

- A. We are called to love our enemies
  - i. Is completely different than the world
    - a. Shows a powerful witness for Jesus
  - ii. Do not seek revenge
  - iii. We are to desire that they come to know God
    - a. Understand that they don't understand what they are doing
  - iv. Show them Jesus' love for you

- B. We are called to forgive our enemies
  - i. Not hold their sins against them
  - ii. Not continually bring it up
  - iii. See it as a joy to suffer as Jesus did
    - a. Acts 5:40:41
    - b. James 1:2-4
  - iv. Need to show them Jesus who forgives
- C. We are called to pray for our enemies
  - i. Not praying for them to suffer as well
  - ii. Pray for them even in the midst of your suffering at their hands
  - iii. Pray for them to know Jesus
- D. We too were God's enemies
  - i. Colossians 1:21-23
  - ii. Romans 5:10

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## MATTHEW 27:45-56

### Context

- Jesus has come to spread the Kingdom of God
- Jesus has had a ministry of teaching and healing that has impacted many people
- Crowds routinely gathered around Jesus and followed Him wherever He went
- The people are wondering whether Jesus is the Christ because of His teaching and miracles
- Jesus' time has come and He goes to Jerusalem to fulfill His purpose by dying on the cross
- Jesus is now with His disciples in the Upper Room sharing their last meal together the night before He is to die
- Judas has agreed to betray Jesus and leaves dinner to do so
- Jesus wants to make sure that they understand who He really is and why He really came before He goes to the cross
- Jesus is betrayed and arrested and is tried falsely and condemned to die
- After beating him and mocking Him, Jesus is put on the cross to die in order to inflict maximum pain and shame
- Jesus' crucifixion was all a part of God's plan

### Outline

- I. **Jesus is on the cross**
  - A. After forgiving the crowds and the robber there was darkness over all the land
    - i. From noon (6th hour) to 3pm (9th hour)
    - ii. Was a supernatural darkness
  - B. Jesus hangs there in agony waiting to die

## II. Jesus speaks

- A. Cried out in a loud voice—wanted all to hear
- B. “My God, My God, why have you forsaken me?”
  - i. Forsaken—means left alone or cut off from
  - ii. God turned His back on Jesus at this moment
    - a. Why?
      - 1. Because all of our sin past, present and future was on put on Jesus
      - 2. Because God is holy He can't be around sin
  - iii. Jesus was cut off from the Father for the first time
    - a. Would have been even more painful than the physical pain
    - b. Was completely alone
- C. Jesus cried out again
  - i. John tells us what he says in 19:30
  - ii. It is finished
    - a. Jesus is telling us that His job is now done
      - 1. Had accomplished the purpose for which He came
    - b. Jesus is telling us that sin is done
      - 1. We no longer have to fear sin and death
      - 2. He has conquered our enemies
    - c. Jesus is telling us that our striving is done
      - 1. We no longer have to try and earn God's favor with sacrifices
      - 2. He is the once-for-all sacrifice for our sins
      - 3. He has done for us what we could not do for ourselves
    - d. He has won our battle for us
- D. Jesus died
  - i. Gave up His Spirit to God
  - ii. Was trusting God to the very end

### III. The effects of Jesus' death

- A. The curtain of the temple was torn in two
  - i. Curtain separated the Holy Place from Most Holy Place
    - a. Where God's Presence was
    - b. No one could enter Most Holy Place except High Priest and then only once a year
    - c. Shows that the barrier between God and man is now gone
      - 1. Man can freely approach God Himself through blood of Jesus
      - 2. Doesn't need a priest or sacrifices anymore
  - ii. Jesus' sacrifice made a way for people to approach God
- B. Earthquake
  - i. Creation itself reacts to Jesus' death
  - ii. Rocks were split and it was felt in the whole land
- C. The tombs were opened
  - i. Those who had died rose up and were seen by the people
  - ii. Proof of Jesus' power over death
- D. Response of those around Jesus
  - i. "Truly this was the Son of God"
  - ii. All that happened pointed to Jesus
  - iii. They were in awe
    - a. Another word for worship

### IV. SO WHAT??!!!

- A. Our sin is a big deal
  - i. We sometimes think it doesn't matter
  - ii. Keeps us from being able to be in God's Presence
    - a. Our sin made God turn His back on Jesus His Son
- B. Jesus loves you enough to be cut off from His Father
  - i. Was a price He willingly paid for us



- C. Jesus has made a way for us to go straight to God
  - i. His blood shed
  - ii. His sacrifice that takes away our sin
- D. How will you respond?
  - i. Is He truly the Son of God to you?

- After being beaten and mocked, Jesus is put on the cross to die in order to inflict maximum pain and shame
- Jesus died as a part of God's plan

    - e. Go and tell His disciples what you have seen and that you will see Him again
  - iv. Jesus was not there
    - a. Had brought Himself back to life
    - b. Had taken away the power and fear of death

**III. Jesus appears to them**

- A. As they went to obey the angel Jesus met them
- B. "Greetings"
- C. They took hold of Jesus' feet
  - i. He was not a spirit but flesh and blood
  - ii. Had really resurrected
  - iii. Had a body
- D. Told them to not be afraid
  - i. Of Him
  - ii. Of death

## III. Jesus shows us to Thomas

- A. Eight days had gone by
  - i. We expect Jesus to handle our doubts right then but that's not always the case
- B. The disciples are together in a locked room
  - i. Were afraid of religious leaders
  - ii. Remembered Jesus' words about what will happen to them
    - a. World will hate you
    - b. When you go before the authorities
  - iii. Were expecting to be arrested and killed as followers of Jesus
- C. Jesus came to see Thomas
  - i. Was a very personal visit
  - ii. Speaks to Thomas
    - a. "Put your finger here, and see my hands... and place it [your hand] in my side"
    - b. Not speaking in a frustrated or angry way
      - 1. What we expect
      - 2. Think God is completely disappointed by our doubts

- 3. Is angry with us for doubting
  - c. Speaks gently and tenderly and directly to his doubts
  - d. Offers the proof that he wanted
- iii. Thomas believes
  - a. Calls Jesus "My Lord and My God"
  - b. Knew who Jesus truly was
- D. Jesus speaks to us
  - i. Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed
  - ii. There is a unique blessing for us who believe and haven't seen Jesus
    - a. We may never have all our questions answered how we want
    - b. God has provided all we need to believe
      - 1. Creation
      - 2. His Word
      - 3. Other believers

#### IV. SO WHAT?!!!

- A. Jesus is not afraid of our doubts
  - i. He is not surprised by them
  - ii. It does not make Him less powerful if we doubt
- B. Jesus handles our doubts with love
  - i. Jesus comes to us individually
  - ii. In His timing and not ours
    - a. We want answers now but often we need to wrestle with the question longer
    - b. His timing is perfect
    - c. Reveals Himself when we are ready to listen and believe
  - iii. Is not frustrated or angered by our doubts
  - iv. He knows that we will doubt from time to time
    - a. It is a very normal part of being a Christian
    - b. Don't need to feel guilty about it

- c. Need to take our doubts to Jesus and His Word in prayer
  - 1. Jesus wants us to believe
  - 2. We need to be honest and admit our doubts
  - 3. We need to look for the truth
  - 4. We need to trust what we know to be true
  - 5. His ultimate goal is our faith that leads to worship of Him

- i. Power of the Holy Spirit

  - ii. He will continue to be with you FOREVER
- C. Would give them the courage they needed during difficult days

IV. SO WHAT??!!

- A. Jesus calls us as well
  - i. Go and make disciples of all nations
    - a. We need to be looking for opportunities to share Him
    - b. We need to help people grow in Him

- B. We are to trust in God's power and not our own
  - i. He promises us the Holy Spirit
  - ii. He even says that we will do greater things than He did
- C. We all have a unique story of God's love to share
  - i. You are a unique creation of God's
    - a. There never has been nor ever will be someone like you
    - b. You have a unique story of God's grace and love that no one else has
  - ii. You are called to share that story
    - a. You can speak about God in a way that no one else can
- D. He will be with you
  - i. He is there to be your helper and lover all the days of your life
  - ii. Therefore you have nothing to fear
    - a. If God is for us who can be against us- Romans 8:31
